American Golf Pros Qualify In British Matches

SANDWICH, ENG., May 8 (AP)—Jose Jurado of Argentina, lightweight contestant for British golf honors, turned in a sterling 69 to take the lead in the second qualifying round of the open championship today.

Jurado scored 75 yesterday and his aggregate of 144 placed him three strokes under the 147 to H. C. Jolly, compiled earlier for the two days play.

The little, little South American provided the biggest thrill of the two days play when he whaled his ball through the wind over all obstacles to the greens where he was putting for birdies at nearly every hole. He scored his 69 by sending a 32 foot putt spinning home on the home hole for a birdie three. He was out in 35 and home in 34.
