"Divine Woman" At Arcade Today

Surrounded by the most important cast she has had since coming to America, Greta Garbo rises to new film heights in "The Divine Woman," her latest Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer starring production, which is opening today at the Arcade theater for a three day run.

In addition to her great supporting cast Miss Garbo has the best picture vehicle which has been given to her during her two years in America. Yet, despite these surroundings, she stands out as a real star in the magnificent production.

"The Divine Woman" is a screen adaptation of Gladys Unger's "Starlight," which many of you may remember as a Doris Keane starring vehicle on the stage. It is safe to say that in its translation to the screen "The Divine Woman" has been greatly improved upon as a starring vehicle because of the wide latitude which the screen allows over the cramped range offered by the stage.

Mention should also be made of the excellence of the lesser roles.
