

County Will Be Represented At Health Sessions

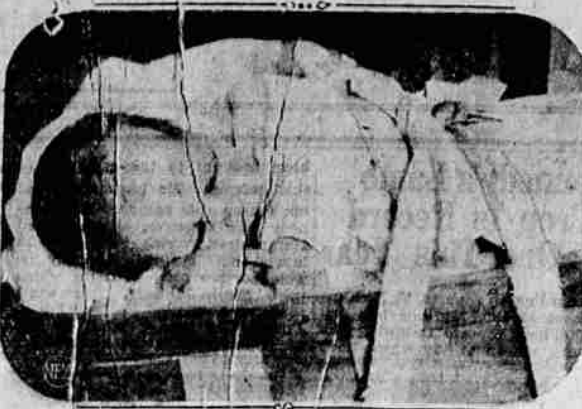
The annual meeting of the National Tuberculosis association will be held in Portland the week of June 18, in the Masonic Temple. This is the second time the national association has met in the Northwest, the first time being in Seattle in 1915, and it is expected that there will be large delegations from the western states.

The Union County Public Health association is affiliated with the State Tuberculosis association and the state association is affiliated with the national. At a recent meeting of the executive committee of the Union county association, it was voted to send one delegate from each community of the county to the national meeting. Such delegates will return to report to their own communities the progress in national, state and local work. Opportunities are to be provided for local delegates to meet representatives of other states and particularly of the western states.

The county association is composed of a volunteer membership, and welcomes the co-operation of any citizens of the county. The association was organized in November, 1919, and its major activity has been the promotion and support of the county public health nursing program, cooperating with the county court. Through the activities of the association, in addition to this nursing program, some form of health work has been promoted in every school district of the county.

In a recent address received by Robert Eakin, president, from Mrs. Dunbar, executive secretary of the Oregon Tuberculosis association, she says: "The decision of the executive committee of the Union

THE SAFETIES OF SURGERY

These are the days of specialization in medicine, so different from days gone by: when the family doctor was called he made the diagnosis and treated the ailment according to his own methods.

Now, when one is ill, the specialist is often called in consultation, whether it be a medical or a surgical disease. I believe this is the proper procedure.

The surgical specialists of today brought surgery to a place of safety. With all the laboratory tests and modern means of aiding in diagnosis the patient, when taken to the hospital for operation, is confident of being helped. He wants an x-ray of his gall bladder or kidney to determine whether stones may or may not be seen. He may suggest a blood count to learn whether his blood has enough red cells or white cells or perhaps too many cells. He knows that, to tolerate the operation he is anticipating, his blood must be in good condition.

The people of today know that all these tests and means of diagnosis and cure are in the hands of the surgeon and they want them. They go to the hospital now with much less persuasion than they did a few years ago, because the modern hospital has attained a high standard in almost all communities, and each year this standard rises higher and higher. The staff members want to give the best service, and to do this they must apply all the means of safety.

Those afflicted with surgical diseases should not hesitate to inform their physician early. If a rupture is taken in time we would have no strangulated hernia. It can be permanently cured by operation. If a small lump in the breast is reported to the physician early, we would not have women dying of cancer of the breast; not only a lump in the breast but a lump that seems to get larger and at times sore in other parts of the body should be reported at once. A pain in the abdomen often thought to be a beginning of appendicitis, may be a beginning of appendicitis. If all the cases of appendicitis were operated upon the first or second day, our casualty list following operations for appendicitis would be almost nil.

Thus the safety of surgery, after considering all that science has given us so far in aiding diagnosis and helping to bring about relief and cure, in a great measure rest with the individuals themselves.

Have your doctor give you a thorough examination occasionally. The much talked of periodic health examination these days is one way of checking up on your health. You will feel better for having it done.

It is one of the easiest annuals to grow and comes into bloom very quickly. It is not particular as to soil but the richer the soil the more vigorous the plants and the longer their season of bloom. Sow in the open ground as soon as the soil is warm and thin to six inches apart. It is better to sow and thin than to transplant, as it does not stand transplanting as well as some of the annuals, although it can be handled in this manner if care is taken not to disturb the root system and it is thoroughly watered in and shaded for a day or two. It can be started indoors for an early display and is now sold in paper pots by florists for quick effect. It is, however, so easily raised at home that a fine supply may be had for a dime.

There are semi-double sorts but the single varieties are the most popular. There are large flowering kinds with imposing trusses but they are not as free flowering as the smaller types. The large flowering type is known as the grandiflora section. The smaller flowering and the best for bedding and masses of color is the nana compacta section. There are also a fringed section and star flowered section, the petals being curiously cut and pointed. These two have not the garden value of the other types but are beautiful as variety. A handsome strain is known as the Cecily, all the flowers having distinct white eyes.

MOTORIZE FISHING BOATS

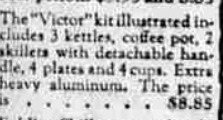

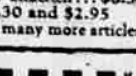

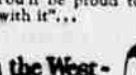
