

NEW CHEVROLET MODEL OFFERED

Convertible Sport Cabriolet Is Announced by Avery Harrison

In the low-priced automobile field the Chevrolet Motor Company has become the pioneer of another distinctive style feature—a convertible sport cabriolet with body by Fisher—announcement of which is made for this district by Avery Harrison, of the local dealer organization.

Combining all the advantages of the sport cabriolet as a closed car with the open car features of the roadster, this latest offering of the world's largest automobile producing company is ideally suited to every type of weather under all kinds of driving conditions.

Of two to four-passenger capacity, the convertible cabriolet has the top up resembles the sport cabriolet in appearance. The top, however, is fully collapsible and folds so completely out of the way that full vision ahead is possible from the rumble seat. An additional feature is the inclusion of a nickel hand around the windows, which gives them rigidity and permits the windows to be raised with the top lowered, affording effective protection against the wind.

Finished in Roman red, with black body beading striped in gold, and embellished with artistic patterns of polished nickel, the model rounds a distinctive style note in the field of low-cost transportation. The disk wheels are of the same brilliant color combination as is the body.

"The soft, folding, rubber-fabric top is jet black, in pleasing contrast to the dominant tones of the body," said Mr. Harrison. "The Fisher body retains the graceful sweeping lines that distinguished the former cabriolet, and other features are of the same dependable construction which so quickly popularized the 'bigger and better' Chevrolet."

Dodge Brothers Allows A Very Small Variation

One seventh of a teaspoonful is a small volume compared to a pint and a half, but forms the injection standard maintained by Dodge Brothers, Inc., in machine combustion chambers of engines to insure smooth performance.

Slight variations in the sizes of the combustion chambers are inevitable when the cylinder head is cast in the foundry, according to A. H. Knight, consulting engineer for Dodge Brothers. If this exists in the finished engine, the charges in the different cylinders will be compressed to various pressures, and the successive explosions will be of unequal strength, causing rough engine performance.

"During recent years, several manufacturers of cars in higher priced fields have solved this problem by machining the engine combustion chambers," said Mr. Knight, "but the introduction of

the practice in the lower priced fields has been discouraged largely by the lack of adaptability of the machine tools available to large production schedules, and by the extra cost of performing the milling operations.

"As part of the tool equipment for producing the engines for two new lines of Sixes, the Victory and the Standard, Dodge Brothers installed 22 six spindle combustion chamber profile millers, having a total capacity of 1,200 cylinder heads in a nine-hour shift."

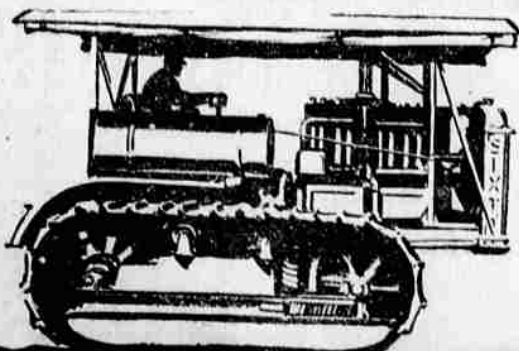
