Some housewives would like to have them oiled if it weren't that they fear the damage to be done by oil tracked into homes. Others suggest a light dust-laying oil. Perhaps sprinkling activities could be extended to help the situation. We are sure it will have the attention of the proper authorities when any improvement can be made.

Lawyers of Portland took a secret ballot yesterday on the candidates for district and supreme benches. We know not who is responsible for the idea, but they deserve commendation, the choice of so large a group of attorneys being a good guide for those laymen who are uninitiated in court requirements. It is worthy of note that Chief Justice Rand and Justice Rossman of the supreme court were both given a large and significant majority over their one opponent. That choice will, we are sure, be the choice of voters throughout the state at the Friday election.

BENEFITS OF LAZINESS

Samuel Krueger, "King of Logarithms," has come from Germany with his bag of tricks. He can multiply faster than a multiplying machine, and just as accurately. He has new methods of his own, by which he performs incredible mathematical feats as easily as most of us use the multiplication table up to 12. There is nothing mysterious about it, he says—no intuition, no special inspiration. He is merely quick-minded with figures, and has a good method.

The most interesting fact about this arithmetical wizard is the way he became one. He explains that he invented his short-cuts because he was too lazy to figure by the usual processes.

There is a rather plausible theory that most of the world's progress is made in exactly this way. Ordinary people wear themselves out doing things in a hard way. Along comes an occasional person, frankly lazy, and sits and figures out some easier way to do something. That puts him ahead, and maybe everybody else.

It may be said that inventors and discoverers are usually active-minded, though lazy-bodied. Yet this isn't necessarily true. There are inventive geniuses who are willing to work their minds hard for long stretches in order to evolve a process enabling them to go along half-asleep afterward, merely waking up again occasionally to make some additional improvement.

Ease, then, comes by thinking, and laziness makes the world go round. But since these mathematical wizards are rather scarce, we imagine calculating machines will continue to be manufactured.
