ELECTION DAY TOMORROW

Voters of Oregon have the privilege tomorrow of selecting the candidates in the two main parties who will seek public office at the general election in November. Campaigns are over; the choice has been made largely in the minds of most citizens. Most of them will go to the polls with the sincere desire to pick the best candidate to the best of their knowledge and belief.

That's a duty everyone should find pleasure in doing. Election days are the few days of the year when equality of citizenship and of authority in government becomes an established fact. The man or woman who votes with sincerity has done his or her part in the job of governing. The man or woman who doesn't has side-stepped an obligation and has no right to a hearing in the event that the right or wrong of an administration attracts attention.

Fortunately for our governmental affairs, political conditions have changed greatly in the last generation. Perhaps no greater proportion of people vote on election days now than before, but it is generally admitted that they exercise the franchise with far greater independence, with greater intelligence, with greater discrimination. It's therefore no longer possible for anyone to "deliver" the votes of a community, especially in the old sense of the term. Newspapers and party publications no longer have the power to dictate public opinion. It must be built on confidence, on truth, on logic or not at all.

For these reasons it is particularly vital to our community, state, and national welfare that everyone vote when they have the privilege. "Vote as you please, but be sure to vote!" is more than a slogan—it's an appeal to good citizenship. If viewed in that light and treated as an obligation, we are confident that the results will prove best for our general welfare.

Resolution Is Adopted By Bar Association Here

The following resolution was passed at a meeting of the bar association here yesterday:

WHEREAS attacks have heretofore been made upon the judicial attitude and personal character of Chief Justice John L. Rand of the state supreme court; and

WHEREAS every lawyer is interested in the maintenance of the purity and reputation of the judiciary, not only in theory but in fact, and believing that the genesis of the aforesaid attacks upon the chief justice can be found either in politics or in business as they affect individual members of the Multnomah bar; and

WHEREAS this association is convinced that the charges made are without basis in fact, and that the Chief Justice has been (albeit accused as to attitude of mind upon a case which has now become famous in the judicial literature of the state; and

WHEREAS this association regards it as the duty of men who have known the Chief Justice as a practicing attorney for more than a generation, as many members of this association have known him, to declare their convictions as to his honesty, his integrity and his commanding talents.

NOW, WHEREFORE: be it resolved that this association expresses its complete confidence in the character, the sterling integrity, the outstanding ability and the scrupulous personal honor which Chief Justice John L. Rand typifies in Oregon.
