NEW YORK (AP)—This city is the largest potato market in the United States.

Figures available for the six years from 1920 to 1925 inclusive show that on the average 18,488 carloads were marketed annually in New York alone. This quantity represents more than eight percent of the country's total carload shipments.

Maine, Virginia and New York state supply the greater part of the potatoes for this market.

AT THE THEATERS

Lavish Screen Spectacle At the Arcade

Castles—streets—towns—villages—these are some of the things built for a single motion picture in what will probably prove the most elaborately-made motion picture production for years to come.

The production is "The Student Prince," Metro-Goldwyn Mayer's huge super spectacle now playing at the Arcade theater, with Ramon Novarro and Norma Shearer in the leading roles, directed by Ernst Lubitsch, master director from Europe, and staged on probably the most gorgeous scale in the history of the screen.

"The Student Prince" was filmed as a new departure on the screen; a simple love story of a boy and a girl, but set in surroundings that depict an entire nation.

Several thousand people appear in its massive scenes; in the colorful coronation ceremonies; the great public demonstration of welcome to a new ruler; revels of university students in the inn of Heidelberg and the making of a new monarch, all worked out with absolutely true fidelity of life.

The famous story of the unhappy Prince Karl Heinrich and his pathetic sweetheart of the inn are told just as it was told on the stage by Richard Mansfield, but with a background that the stage could never reproduce. The cast includes such celebrities as Jean Hersholt, Edward Connelly, Edythe Chapman, Bobby Mack, Olga Harlan, Lionel Belmore, George K. Arthur, Gustav Von Seyffertitz, Philippe De Lacy and many others.

Air Hero In "Sky Raider" At The Star

In a fierce air battle over the fields of France an American, flying for the first time in battle, covered himself with glory. In the same flying squadron, fighting for the same cause, was a Frenchman whose heroism had been proven many times. But luck was against him that day. Something was wrong with his engine—he couldn't get speed or power; then an explosive bullet went off in his teeth. With jaw shattered he staggered his plane to earth. He became France's greatest living Ace—but the American was court-martialed and sentenced to twenty years in prison. Because all evidence pointed to him as the cause of the Frenchman's failure—a failure that nearly resulted in his death.

This tremendous air battle and the dramatic court-martial might be called the prologue of "The Sky Raider," the Encore Picture featuring Jacqueline Logan and Captain Charles Nungesser at the Star.

What happens to him when he becomes tangled up in the meshes of a couple of heart-breaking maniacs affords many a laugh in a comedy of the type that only Langdon can make.

A remarkable note of accuracy has been attained due to the vast research work which was made in order to recreate the original atmosphere and background. There is all the splendor and thrill of those bygone days which featured daring chivalry and free-and-easy knife throwing.

Fred as the gallant and hospitable "High-Spinner" Don Mike has the most interesting role of his career, and presents a brilliant characterization that is charged with sincerity and virile power. Ruth Clifford is the lovely lady wooed by the hitherto indifferent Don, while others in the cast are: Noel Young, Albert Prieto, William Courtright, Tom Bates, Norma Marie and Carmen Le Roux. Silver King again amazes and delights his admirers with his endless source of new stunts and his proximity to human intelligence.
