Ice Dangers In Byrd's Flight Held As Slight

LANGLEY FIELD, Va. (AP)—

One of the perils which most folk expect Commander Richard E. Byrd to encounter on his Antarctic flights, the formation of ice on the wings and other vital parts of his plane, is much less likely to prove a major difficulty than has been supposed.

Researches conducted in the laboratories here of the national advisory committee for aeronautics have produced much unexpected information on this phase of airplane operation at low temperatures, not the least striking of which is that ice forms on the wings and struts only within a very narrow temperature range close to the freezing point.

Temperatures a few degrees above or below that point, it was found, are free from the ice danger, which lies in the changing of the shape of the wings by the coating of frozen vapor and the consequent reduction of their lifting capacity.

Suggesting that planes be equipped with good thermometers, they explained that such an instrument would give a pilot ample warning of the ice danger. Approaching a cloud formation, he could determine quickly whether to descend to a warmer level or rise to a colder zone. If the cloud should be so deep that he could not rise above it and the temperature near the ground so close to the freezing point that descent would merely increase the danger, he could go through the cloud with greater safety at the higher, colder altitude, instead of ice, the vapor would become attached only to the leading edge of the wing in the form of light, fluffy snow, which could be shaken off easily by shifting the angle of his plane.

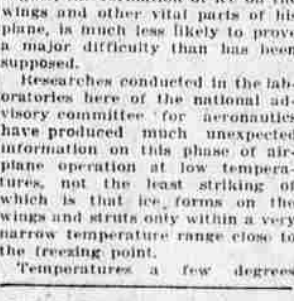

Freighter And Liner Collide; Several Drown

VINEYARD HAVEN, Mass., June 1 (AP)—An undetermined number of the freighter Kershaw, variously estimated from seven to 12 were drowned here this morning when their ship was rammed and sunk by the Boston-bound Dollar Liner President Garfield. Thirty members of the Kershaw's crew including Captain Brooks were rescued.

The collision occurred a few miles off East Chop, island of Martha's Vineyard at 12:30 a. m., with a clear sky and smooth sea.

According to Captain G. H. Moir, spokesman here for the Dollar Line company, the President Garfield was proceeding at 14 knots when it struck the Boston-to-Norfolk bound Kershaw on the latter's port side, just forward of the bridge.

The Kershaw rolled over and the vessels held together for a few moments. Then the freighter broke apart and went down within 10 minutes of the crash in 80 feet of water.

The President Garfield stood by for four hours to pick up survivors and was aided by a crew of coast guardsmen from the Woodhole station. After placing a buoy to mark the spot, the Garfield proceeded to this harbor where at 7 o'clock it weighed anchor for Boston. It was expected to reach that point at 4 o'clock this afternoon.

BOATS MAKE SEARCH WOODSHOLE, Mass., June 1 (AP)—Three boats from the coast guard station here, which have been out all night seeking survivors of the crew of the freighter Kershaw, sunk about midnight by the steamer President Garfield, were continuing the search this forenoon.

Commander Fred A. Nichols, of the station said that all but six or seven of the Kershaw's crew have been accounted for, having been picked up immediately after the crash by the President Garfield.
