"Husbands For Rent" At Arcade Sunday

"Husbands for Rent" is the title of the riotous comedy which Warner Bros. presents at the Arcade theater Sunday only. Featured in the cast are Owen Moore and Helene Costello. Others are Kathryn Perry, John Miljan, Claude Gillingwater, Arthur Hoyt, Helen Lynch and Hugh Herbert. Graham Baker made the adaptation from the story of Edwin Justin Mayer.

Henry Lehman directed and a good job he did. For "Husbands for Rent" is acclaimed wherever shown as one of the very funniest films of the year.
