U. S. MAY BREAK SPEAR MONOPOLY

Kuck and Rinehart America's Hopes to Win in Javelin Event

JAVELIN CHAMPIONS. NEW YORK (AP)—Olympic javelin throwing champions and their marks.

By Alan J. Gould. (Associated Press Sports Editor). NEW YORK (AP)—The pendulum in athletics strikes a pretty fair average on the whole, but it has been swinging all one way in Olympic javelin tossing.

Since the spear-tossing event was added to the international meet in 1906 the title hasn't strayed from the Scandinavian sector.

But this title has been shifting. America may break this monopoly at Amsterdam, especially if either Mihner Rinehart, of Indiana, or John Kuck, of Kansas and Los Angeles happens to be in form.

The world's record is a little over 218 feet, but Kuck has been credited with hurling the steel-tipped implement over 230 feet in practice.
