Warns Children Of Kite Flying Danger

Children! Enjoy flying your kites, but be especially careful to keep kites and strings away from electric wires. This is substance in the suggestion coming from the Eastern Oregon Light and Power company, which states that the country is now threaded with a network of many miles of wire which transmits electricity at high voltages, and that if kites become tangled up on the wires, children flying them may suffer an electric shock.

"In some states children have been killed this year because they used paper strings and because they tried to rescue kites from wires," says the power company. It is not the old-fashioned kite with the wooden frame that presents the warning. It is the new kind of kite arrangement and metal type of kite, as well as the copper wire strings which are being used, that are particularly dangerous.
