## Slight Drop In Eggs Prices In Portland Market

PORTLAND, Ore., June 15 (AP)—Standard extra and medium first grades of eggs were quoted a half cent higher today. Prices were 25c per pound in the balance of the market was unchanged.

Country dressed meats and poultry were steady and unchanged. Poultry receipts continued heavy, but prices held steady.

Although a little Lake Lahineh celery was obtainable, the bulk of the supply was California stock and sold at \$7 per crate; \$2 per dozen bunches.

Strawberries were higher, this morning's receipts being amply sufficient to supply demand, and mostly the local brought from \$1.25 to \$2 per crate.

Locally grown lettuce was also rather scarce and sold around \$1.25 per crate of three dozen heads.

### WOOL REPORT

DOSTON, June 15 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say:

"Business is slower in all branches of the wool textile industry."

"Prices have remained very firm however, both here and abroad, for the most part, although moderate dips in Bradford are possibly a shade easier. The East India sales at Liverpool, however, have been steady and the new crop season in England is opening very strong."

"The manufacturing in this market is quiet but the advent of better weather conditions is expected to bring about improvement."

"In the west new clip operations have slowed appreciably and some wool is being taken here and there at slightly lower clean landed costs."

"Merino is still quiet here. American is buying some hair at Constantinople at firm rates."

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## HEAVY BUYING OF OIL SHARES CHECKS SLUMP

NEW YORK, June 15 (AP)—Heavy buying of the oil shares particularly the standard oil group, checked a sharp reaction in today's stock market. Opening gains of 1 to 7 points were wiped out by a general selling movement just before mid-day and in many cases converted into losses equally as large and the market was headed upward again in the early afternoon.

Trading was relatively light in volume, indicating that many traders and small speculators had withdrawn from the market at least temporarily.

High priced specialties were rather hard hit in the morning reaction. Case Threshing, Curtiss, Radio and Cady fell 6 to 8 points below yesterday's final quotations and Greene, Capper, General Motors, Allied Chemical, International Harvester, International Telegraph, Bellmont and Leland and Hudson sold down 4 to nearly 6 points.
