WALLA WALLA TO BE HERE SUNDAY

Change in Lineup Is Announced - Sabin Rich May Pitch for Bears

WALLA WALLA, June 16—Faced by a contest in La Grande Sunday and compelled to make changes in the team as players come and go, Louis Beck, field manager of the Walla Walla Bears in the Blue Mountain baseball league, was studying the lineup today.

Use of Lefty Ray Edwards of Milton in the field is expected to add hitting power. Edwards is home from the University of Oregon, where he helped win the 1928 championship in the northern section of the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate athletic conference.

Wilbur Eckart, with the closing of Whitman college for the summer, goes to his home in Seattle. This leaves a hole at short, into which Beck considers moving Sney Yenny from second. This would necessitate other changes in the lineup, involving possibly Bridgewater, who has been playing third, and other players.

Sabin Rich, former Whitman star, promised to see Beck about pitching for the Bears, upon arrival here for the summer. Rich is coach at Vallejo, and has been winning games in a California bush league. He was formerly mentor at Wa-Hi and played with Touchet.

Negotiations were afoot with Benoy Karlson, former Missionary catcher.

All these uncertainties with lineup are expected to come to a head with final practice this evening for the La Grande game.

ST. LOUIS TOPS NATIONAL CLUBS

Cincinnati Reds Pushed Out of First Place by .800 Spurt

By the Associated Press. The St. Louis Cardinals, champions of 1926 and near-repeaters last season, have winged their way to the top of the National League standings.

Two weeks of better than .800 per cent ball climaxed by a thrilling 14-inning triumph over Brooklyn yesterday, 5-2, enabled the Cardinals to climb over the Cincinnati Reds and head the parade.

The Reds unfortunately for them, picked yesterday to lose to the Phillies 8-7 and now rate in second place, 15 percentage points back of the leaders.

The New York Giants subdued Pittsburgh 3-1. Vic Aldridge, traded by Pittsburgh for Burleigh Grimes, allowed only six hits and rapped out a home run and two singles and scored three runs.

With Hornaby under a five-day suspension for his protest against umpire Pfirman's decision calling him out on strikes, the Boston Braves proceeded to lose their seventh straight game, this time to the Cubs 5-4.

The New York Yankees lost their 11th contest of the season to St. Louis 5-4, despite Babe Ruth's 24th homer of the year.

The Philadelphia Athletics cut the Yankee's lead to eight and a half games by pounding out an easy 12 to 5 verdict over the floundering Indians at Cleveland.

Continuing their return to the form expected of them before the season started, Washington made it two in a row over Detroit 5-4 in 19 innings.

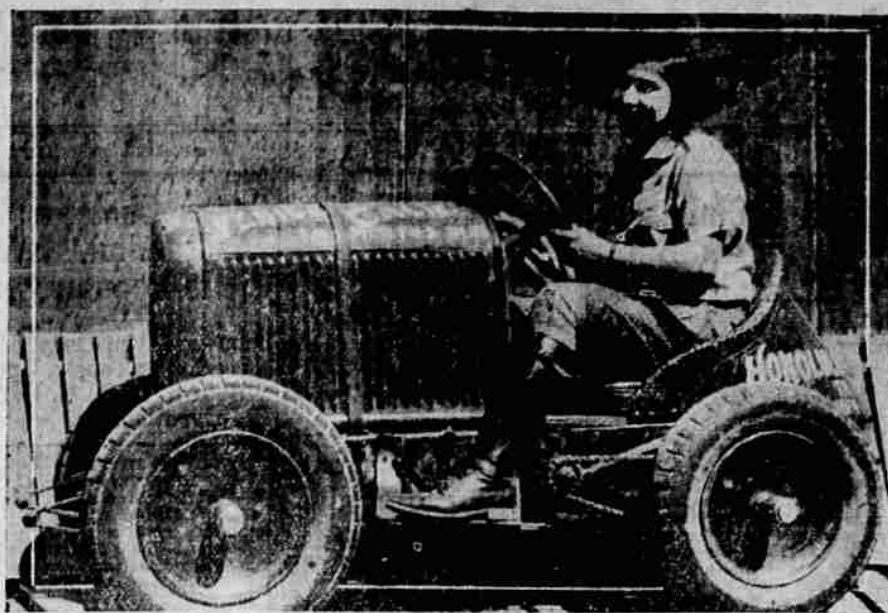
England's Best Tennis Player Loses To Helen

FLYING CLOUD FAR AHEAD IN COAST DERBY

WILLETTS, Cal., June 16 (AP)—Running with seemingly effortless determination, Flying Cloud, the Karok Indian, who is one of the Oregon Cave men's entries in the Redwood highway marathon, today was still miles ahead of the rest of the field.

At 7:10 a. m., he passed through this town, 24 miles from Ukiah, his starting place two hours earlier.

A dozen miles south of Willets were his three closest contenders, Crescent Feather, Red Robin and Chief Ukiah, bunched in that order within three miles of each other.

Meanwhile Mad Bull, winner of the 1927 marathon, who was forced to drop out temporarily yesterday because of leg trouble and blistered feet, surprised spectators by courageously starting again, this time from Cloverdale, where he rested all night.

At 6 a. m. today he was making a mighty effort to cut down the 50 or more mile gap that remains between him and his fellow Karok.
