

Training Horses For Enterprise July 4th Races

ENTERPRISE, Ore., June 22 (Special)—Many race horses from the outside are training on the local race track in preparation for the Fourth of July celebration and race meet to be held here July third and fourth. The committee in charge reports that more race horses will be at this celebration than ever before and likewise the largest aggregation of buckers is being assembled in the history of the track. Geo. Richards, secretary of the stockman's association here reports that word from officials of the Oregon Cattle and Horse Raisers association is to the effect that they expect the largest attendance of stockmen from all over the state at this year's annual state convention which convenes here during the celebration for many years. Many new members were added to the state organization this spring at the district gatherings and all were urged to attend the annual meeting.

"Flying Fortress" Tested By Army

NORFOLK, Va. (AP)—America's "Flying Fortress" is undergoing varied tests here to determine its value as a war weapon for America. The Flying Fortress is a giant Keystone LB-6 bombing airplane, weighing six and a half tons and capable of carrying 2,300 pounds of bombs.

The LB-6 is capable of a speed of more than 120 miles an hour when fully loaded and was built to make bombing raids at an altitude of 14,000 feet. The air monster has a wingspread of 75 feet and is equipped with engines developing 1,950 horsepower.

For defensive and offensive purposes this latest type of bomber is armed with five machine guns, has a complete radio equipment, flares for night landing and carries a crew of five men.

The tests of the plane are being made by the entire flying personnel of the second bombardment group of the army, stationed at Langley field. Each pilot is required to make a written report on the flying qualities of the plane, its speed, ease of control, rate of climb and the distance necessary for a "take-off."
