Yale Juniors Win From Harvard Crew

REGATTA COURSE, New London, Conn., June 22 (AP)—Yale's junior varsity defeated Harvard by eight lengths in the two mile upstream race today, making a clean sweep of the morning races of the prehistoric regatta.

The New Haven sweep swimmers held the lead throughout the race and Harvard never seriously threatened them. Yale rowed at a high stroke. All the oarsmen finished strongly.

Yale's freshman crew won the first event of the day, defeating Harvard's first year crew by four lengths over the two-mile course.

The blue youngsters overcame an early Harvard lead and were never headed, although the crimson staged a desperate rally within three-fourths of a mile of the finish. The Yale's met the challenge, however, and swept over the line an easy winner amid the frantic cheers of the Yale cohorts. Both crews finished in good physical shape.

Amelia Earhart Visits Slums In London District

LONDON, June 22 (AP)—Miss Amelia Earhart, who halted her social work temporarily to fly the Atlantic, returned to it this morning. Visiting one of the largest settlement houses in London, she exclaimed:

"There is no place like home." After enjoying London society for a few days the Boston girl went to the other extreme and spent several hours among the lowliest in the city.

Miss Earhart went to the slums in the east end of London after laying a wreath on the cenotaph of Great Britain's war dead. William Stultz and Louis Gordon, who flew with her in the Friendship, assisted her in placing the wreath, which was inscribed with the names of the fliers.

At Toyenbee hall, Miss Earhart was received by hundreds of wildly cheering youngsters, many of them waving American flags.

Boy scouts and girl scouts formed a long row of honor while Miss Earhart walked to the main door of the building. J. St. C. Catepoole, sub-warden of the hall, met her and escorted her through the various departments.

"You are fortunate," she said, "in dealing with people who understand your language. In Boston we have the difficulty of dealing with a dozen different languages."

Need Wireless Guidance
It is regarded as extremely difficult if not impossible, to strike Noble's position exactly without wireless guidance. Neither of the Norwegian planes searching for the party is equipped with radio. Major Maddalena, who found the Noble party on Wednesday, found it difficult with his excellent radio equipment to locate the marooned men.

When Major Maddalena dropped the supplies Wednesday only one of the parachutes to which the packages were attached failed to open. This fortunately contained fresh batteries and an accumulator for the radio outfit whose strength Noble has been carefully hoarding.

Major Maddalena now plans to drop a new set of batteries carefully packed in a rubber boat so that it will not be damaged in falling on the ice.

With the appearance of some sunshine burning up the fog, Major Maddalena hoped to be able to make another trip before the day ended. His fellow Italian flier, Major Penzo, was planning to get away also if possible.
