Stories of Unfortunate Girls Provided With Happy Endings

ALBION, N. Y. (AP) —Providing pessimistic stories with happy endings is the function of a school here that is considered a model in reforming human lives.

To the Albion State Training school come girls who are bitter against a world that they have found cruel and selfish.

"Most of them have had a pretty raw deal in life; few of them have ever known kindness or consideration from anyone," says Mrs. Flora P. Daniels, superintendent of the school for a dozen years. "Here they find that we are eager to help them and that we treat them as fellow human beings. No one can keep on feeling bitter when she finds only kindness surrounding her."

The institution with its 52 acres of fertile farm land, broad campus and stately trees and homelike adbrick buildings was called a reformatory before the name was changed to "training school."

Under her charge girls who cannot read or write are given the rudiments of education. Others are taught to be efficient housekeepers. Those who show aptitude for business are given a course in bookkeeping, stenography and typewriting.

Youthful costumes and bobbed hair are the fashion at this school, where the age limit is 16 to 26. After adaptation in the "Reception House" the girls join the groups in the eight cottages that house 18 or 19 girls each. In a "nursery cottage" mothers keep their babies with them. When they leave, Mrs. Daniels says the mothers cling to their children no matter how adverse the circumstances.
