"U. S. Smith" At The Colonial Soon

Gotham has a story with plenty of box-office appeal in this one. It is adapted from a Gerald Beaumont story and they are always very human. There is a prize-fight for the championship service, with all of the exciting incidents leading up to it; there is the friendship of the little waif and the champion of the Marines to create sure-fire sentiment and there is romance and rivalry running all the way through it.

Eddie Gribbon is Sergeant Steve Ritley, champion of the Marines and Mickey Bennett becomes "United States Smith" mascot of the Marines. Kenneth Harlan is Corporal Jim Sharkey, Steve's rival for championship honors and also for the love of Lila Lee, who plays Molly Malone. The entire cast does some exceptionally good work, with Gribbon, however, carrying off first honors.

It is a picture that fairly abounds in action and comedy situations that are far above the average. Also the tale is unfolded cleverly and never for a moment is the interest allowed to lag. There is a lot of sentimental hokum in it, but it is of the type that always goes over well. The championship fight with Gribbon and Harlan as the principals has all the earmarks of a real battle. It is put on realistically and without the usual number of knockdowns that characterize these screen battles.

SURGICAL SAFETY FIRST

The layman can feel safe in the way the modern qualified surgeon cares for him. In years gone by when operations were done under surgically unclean conditions on account of undeveloped germ knowledge and ignorance of the dangers of pus, operations had a high death rate. At present the surgeon works with thoroughly scrubbed hands covered with sterilized rubber gloves, gowns and headgear, using only thoroughly sterilized instruments.

The patient is carefully examined, all organs are tested for their possible diseased conditions. Again in order to make safety sure, the surgeon has each vital organ tested for its surgical efficiency in order to find out whether it can stand the strain of the necessary surgical operation. By this we mean

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that kidneys, heart and circulation, and liver are tested to give assurance that they are sufficiently strong to stand the strain of the necessary surgery. The urine is examined for albumin and casts. It is also examined for the presence of sugar. The information derived from a proper examination of a small amount of blood confirms their safety. The blood pressure is taken and a careful direct examination of chest and heart is made with the stethoscope. There are special appliances to carry these tests to more exactness.

When all the information is obtained, the patient can receive a guarantee that the conditions are properly set, and a good result will obtain in doing a certain operation. The surgeon and the patient are satisfied that there is physical and organic efficiency in the vital organs.

Therefore, the world can thank the studious, careful research man and modern progressive medicine for the advancement in the development of surgical procedures. It is good to know that needed surgery can be given with a marked degree of safety and more exact results; the modern surgeon makes "safety" safer.
