Searching For Lowenstein In English Channel

BRUSSELS, July 6 (AP)—In the absence of actual eye-witnesses of the disappearance of Captain Alfred Lowenstein and in the event that his body should not be found, liquidation of the Lowenstein estate may be adjourned for four years under the Belgian laws regarding similar cases.

The Belgian law has no definite provisions for just such a case as that of the Lowenstein death and developments are being watched with the keenest interest in financial circles, especially if any of the captain's business associates, for personal or technical financial reasons, should oppose any attempt at liquidation.

M. Caudeller, Lowenstein's secretary, today denied reports that it was impossible to open the exit door during a trip from Brussels to Paris.

The secretary declared that undoubtedly Captain Lowenstein, leaving the lavatory had absently-mindedly pushed in his usual e-sided way, the wrong door and had fallen through before he knew what was happening.

Lowenstein, he said, was not a man to commit suicide which he considered cowardly.

"He was not in the least down-hearted owing to any recent setbacks," the secretary continued, "and three days ago developed before me a vast scheme for a fresh combine which he was contemplating."
