Latzo Gets His Second Shot At Crown Tonight WILKES BARRE, Pa., July 16 (AP)—Pete Latzo, pugy Scranton miner, gets his second shot at the light heavyweight crown in six weeks when he takes on Tommy Loughran, the clever Philadelphia titleholder in a ten round bout here tonight.

Pete is hoping for a little better luck tonight than he had in his first tangle with Loughran at Ebbets Field, Brooklyn, June 1. The miner entered the ring that night convinced no chance of even making the champion work hard enough to perspire but Pete astounded experts by carrying the fight the whole way.

Fighting before his coal mining friends, Latzo feels it will be another story this time. He has done his best fighting in the hard coal regions. It was at Scranton not far from here, that he relieved Mickey Walker of his welterweight title, only to lose it not long afterward to Joe Dundee of Baltimore. That defeat did not hurt much as it might for Pete was having trouble making the welter weight limit. He grew so fast in fact that he didn't even pause at the middleweight division, passing right into the 175 pounders.

This psychological advantage of fighting at home will not be the only advantage Pete has. The ten round distance is another factor that has figured in the betting which finds Loughran on the long end of odds no better than 5 to 4.
