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Continue Search For Amundsen Party

MOSCOW, July 17 (AP)—New Russian plans for a search for the missing Amundsen party were developed today as the rescue ship Krasin was slowly pounding its way toward Advent Bay carrying seven of the crew of the Italia snatched from the ice last week and the nine members of two rescue parties including the aviator Chukinovsky picked up Sunday night.

With the Krasin temporarily out of the search because of lack of fuel, the second Russian icebreaker Malgina, now in Northern waters, is under instructions to make a thorough search for the Amundsen party.

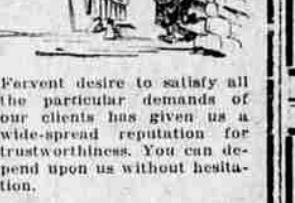
