By the Associated Press Sensational spurts by the Cubs and Pirates have added spice to the National league pennant race just when it began to appear as though the St. Louis Cardinals were going to make it a one-club affair somewhat similar to the situation in the American league where the New York Yankees have distanced the field.

Cardinals Break Even Meanwhile the Cardinals gained an even break with the Brooklyn Dodgers by taking the last game of a four-game series, 7 to 1. Dazzy Vance was removed from the box after the Cards had scored five runs on nine hits in the first five innings. Jess Haines pitched a strong game for the league leaders whose margin over their closest rivals, the Cubs, now stands at four games.

Southpaw Bill Walker was knocked out of the box in the first inning as the Cincinnati Reds salvaged one game out of the series with the New York Giants, 5 to 4.

The Boston Red Sox came out of a slump that had carried them into the American league cellar by stopping the Chicago White Sox's streak, 9 to 6.

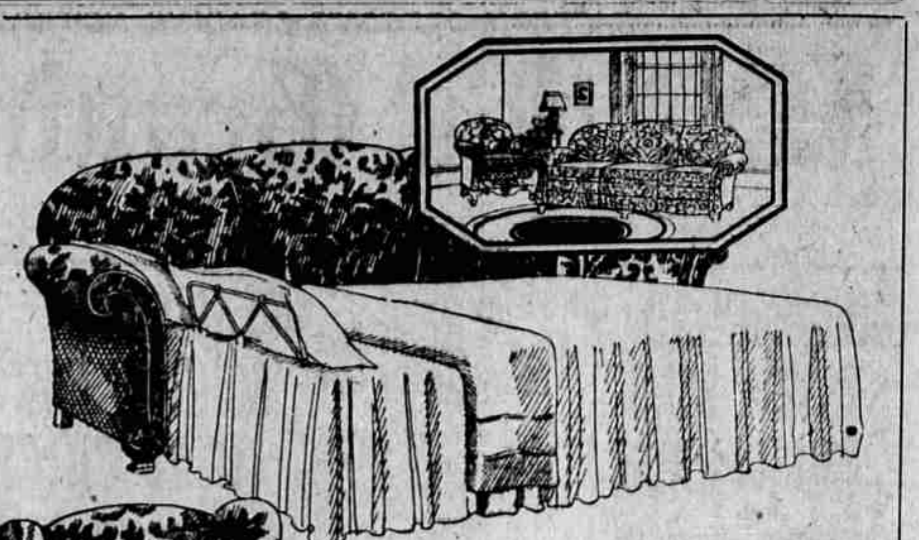
