MENUS

BREAKFAST—Orange juice, cereal, cream, French toast, syrup, milk, coffee.
LUNCHEON—Vegetable hash, lettuce sandwich, peanut cookies, chocolate egg slices.

DINNER—Broiled fish steaks, shadow potatoes, baked eggplant, new beet and cheese salad, lime sherbet, cake, milk, coffee.
Beet and Cheese Salad
 Twelve tiny beets, 1 large pack-

age cream cheese, parsley, 1 cup vinegar, 1/3 cup sugar, 8 whole cloves, 2-inch stick cinnamon broken in small pieces, 1/2 teaspoon salt, mayonnaise, hearts of lettuce. Cook beets until tender, plunge into cold water and slip skins. Combine vinegar, sugar, spices and salt and bring to the boiling point. Pour boiling hot over beets and let stand until cool. Chill in the vinegar. Mince parsley very fine. Make tiny balls of the cream cheese and roll half of them in minced parsley. Put three beets, one plain cheese ball and one parsley covered cheese ball on each salad plate covered with leaves from lettuce hearts. Garnish with mayonnaise and serve at once.

Bridge Pointers

As there is nothing more important in the play of Auction or Contract Bridge than planning, as soon as Dummy's hand is exposed, how to make the most of the twenty-six cards belonging to a Declarer, I am giving this week three more situations in which the opportunity to make important plans occurs. Today, tomorrow and Thursday, I will give the cards of a Closed hand and Dummy, the contract and the card led; my question will be how the Declarer should plan to play the hand. The answer will be given each day, but readers are urged to make up their minds for themselves before they examine the answer.

Today's Hand



Contract one Heart; the King of Diamonds is led, and the Nine of Diamonds played by East on the first trick. Presuming, as Declarer has a right to do, that Diamond lead will be repeated on trick 2, what plan of campaign should Declarer develop?

Declarer's Plan

With the above hand Declarer can see that he must lose one Diamond trick and two Spade tricks; and that he may lose to the King of Clubs. If he fails to win three Club tricks, he will not make game. The only way in which he reasonably can expect to make the three Club tricks is to lead Clubs twice from Dummy. Dummy contains one obvious entry—the Ten of Hearts—but no other apparent entry and, therefore, if Declarer plays along thoughtless lines, he will fall one short of game. There is one and only one reasonable chance for Declarer to make game, and that is by ruffing the second Diamond with an honor, leading a small trump from Closed Hand and, unless West plays the Nine, finessing the Eight in Dummy. This will give Dummy two entries if the Nine of trumps be held by West. It obviously will cost a trick if East have the Nine of trumps; but the trick lost would be "the trick immaterial" because it would not sacrifice the contract, and risk-

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ing it creates a possibility of making a game.

SALEM, Ore., July 24 (AP)—At midnight tonight will expire the period allowed by the law for filing

of negative arguments on measures to be voted on by the people at the November election. Among the arguments to be filed for publication in the voters' pamphlet will be the discussion against the income bill to decrease motor vehicle license fees and increase the gasoline tax from 3 to 5 cents a gallon. This argument is being prepared by J. M. Devera, attorney for the state highway commission.
