## HEALTH

**JAUNDICE**  
By Edmund Andrews, M. D., Chicago, Associate Professor of Surgery, University of Illinois College of Medicine.

Jaundice is a yellowish brown discoloration of the skin. It is caused by the failure of the liver to eliminate certain coloring matters. The substances which give color to the blood, cells are carried in the red blood cells. The life of these cells is but a few days or weeks. New ones are constantly being born in the bone marrow and when the old ones die they are destroyed in the liver and their coloring matter passes into the bile.

For that reason any failure of the liver to carry out its function will cause a damming back of these pigments in the blood, and a staining of the skin, lips, and eyes.

Various diseases of the liver itself may under certain circumstances cause jaundice but the most common cause is disease of the bile ducts. The bile is made in the liver and constantly flows through the ducts into the intestines and blockage of these ducts is the commonest cause of jaundice.

Jaundice, from whatever cause, is a serious disease. While the coloring matter itself is harmless, the mere fact that it is being dammed back means that other more poisonous products are being dammed back also.

The symptoms of this poisoning are: yellowing of the skin, loss of appetite, nausea, vomiting, constipation, and a general feeling of weakness.
