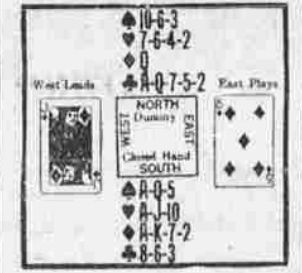

The cards of Dummy and Closed Hand are given, the Jack of Diamonds is led, and the question asked is how declarer should plan to play the hand. MENUS

By Sister Mary

BREAKFAST — Orange juice, cereal, cream, liver and bacon croquettes, oven toast, milk, coffee.

DINNER — Fish, potatoes, creamed potatoes, chard greens with hard cooked eggs, apricot ice cream, sponge cake, milk, coffee.

SUPPER — Bread and milk, gingerbread waffles, coffee.

This menu is suggested for Sunday. The mousse is prepared on Saturday, the potatoes roasted on Saturday and the cake baked on Saturday. On Sunday the potatoes are reheated in cream sauce and the greens are cooked when dinner is wanted. The ice cream is made and packed in the morning and set aside until needed. Setting the table and "setting" dinner will not take more than

half an hour when the family are ready to dine.

The supper of bread and milk is ideal for warm weather and popular with most men.

Gingerbread Waffles

Two eggs, 2 cups pastry flour, 1 teaspoon sugar, 1/2 teaspoon cloves, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 cup molasses, 1/2 cup sugar, 1-3 cup butter, 1 1/2 teaspoons soda, 1/2 cup sour milk.

Mix and sift flour, spices, salt and sugar. Heat molasses and butter to the boiling point. Remove from heat and beat in soda. Add milk and yolks of eggs well beaten. Add dry ingredients and mix thoroughly. Fold in whites of eggs beaten until stiff and dry. Bake quickly on a hot waffle iron and serve with whipped cream slightly sweetened and dusted with powdered sugar.
