SALEM, Ore., Aug. 8 (AP)—Socialist candidates for local, state and district offices, nominated by the assembly several weeks ago in Portland, and whose certificates of nomination were filed with the secretary of state, cannot be designated on the ballot as members of the socialist party. This is the ruling of Attorney General Van Winkle based on the fact that the socialists have failed to conform to the legal requirements for formation of a party. These requirements are that they should have polled at least 5 per cent of the entire vote cast in the state, county, precinct or other electoral district where such nominations were made, or that they should have filed a petition containing the names of at least 5 per cent of the electors of the state.

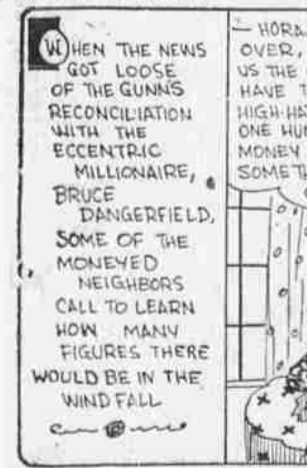

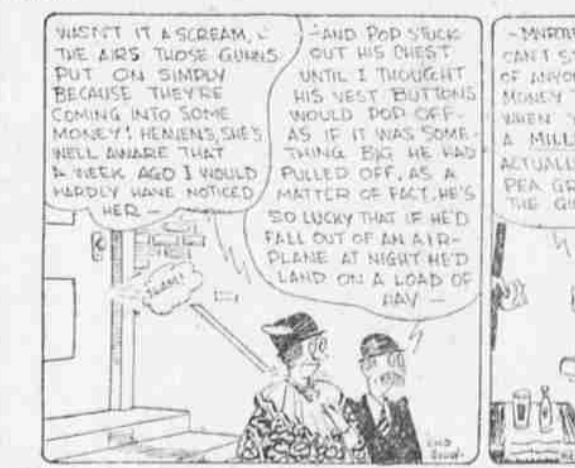
