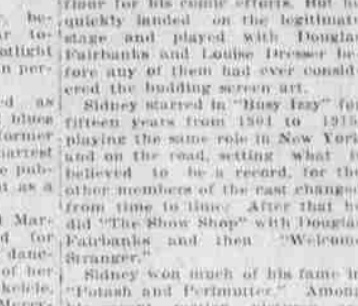
George Sidney Plays In "We Americans"
