

## FEDERAL OFFICER JAILED BY POLICE

"You Can't" He Said But  
They Did Even Though  
One Cop Was Bitten

CHICAGO, Aug. 15. (AP)—"You can't put me in jail," said Deputy United States Marshal Richard J. Murphy at the Warren avenue police station last night. "I'm a government officer."

But they put him in jail anyway, while the desk sergeant wrote the following items on the Murphy's name: (1) resisting a riot; (2) slugging a woman and a man; (3) slugging two policemen; (4) biting a policeman.

Murphy, in his automobile, was on his way to serve two warrants involving dry law violations. His car was held up by a stalled machine driven by Miss Marjorie Meeks, 17, inhabitant of the delay. The deputy, according to Miss Meeks and others in her car, got out of his machine and struck her across the arm with a blackjack.

At the station Murphy was told he would have to remain while the affair was investigated. He thereupon drew his revolver again, informing the bluecoat they could not arrest him. Gentle persuasion was employed to induce Murphy to lower the weapon, following which a half dozen stalwarts fell upon him. It was during this embroilment that one policeman, Kieck's fingers got caught between a pair of teeth, allegedly Murphy's.

Then they locked him up.
