

### WORLD-WIDE PACT MAY BE THE NEXT

#### Signing of Kellogg Agreement May Start a "Big Parade" of Peace

PARIS, (AP)—The big parade of peace that will follow the signing of the Kellogg agreement on August 27 may start a procession that will engulf the world. That first act looking towards the eventual ratification by the original 15 signatory nations of the Kellogg multilateral anti-war treaty is expected to result in other nations' voluntarily joining under the sway of the pact to renounce war as an instrument of national policy.

The treaty as originally offered by Frank B. Kellogg, American secretary of state, was confined to six powers, but was subsequently widened to include 15. It is regarded as likely that the initial ratification ceremonies in the French foreign office will stimulate the interest of other governments.

**Result of Treaty**  
The treaty will result in a confederation of countries agreed to renounce war among themselves and its acceptance marks one of the most ambitious efforts in history to realize world peace.

In the exchange of correspondence with Washington accepting the treaty however, the stipulation of understanding of the terms is made excepting wars of self defense and reserving to each signatory the right to join for itself when war for defense is necessary. for its enforcement. The inception of the treaty dates back to April 6, 1927, when Arthur Balfour, French foreign minister, conveyed to the United States his country's willingness to enter into a pact with this country to have for its enforcement.

The next important step came December 28, 1927, when Mr. Kellogg suggested to Mr. Balfour that the United States and France join in an effort to link all the nations of the world in a declaration renouncing war.

**Original Signatories**  
The original signatory nations are the United States, France, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Great Britain, the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free

State, India, Germany, Italy, Japan and Poland. The first two articles in the treaty contain the nub of it. They are: "The high contracting parties solemnly declare in the names of their respective peoples that they condemn recourse to war for the solution of international controversy, and renounce it as an instrument of national policy in their relations with one another."

"The high contracting parties agree that the settlement or solution of all disputes or conflicts of whatever nature or of whatever origin they may be, which may arise among them, shall never be sought except by pacific means."

The Clerk of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, where the treaty will be signed, entered history January 17, 1919, when Woodrow Wilson, Georges Clemenceau, Lloyd George, Victor Orlando and Monsieur Hymans of Belgium met there to organize the work of the peace conference. It was there the first plenary meeting of the conference gathered six days later. Since then a number of important conferences have been within its walls.

It is not one of the most ornate apartments of the French foreign office. Its principal ornaments are a series of winged cupids on the ceiling that might be taken for symbols of peace. Otherwise the decorations are of a rather meaningless sort. The clock that gave its name to the salon is devoid of history or legend.

**PEACE PROFESSORSHIP**  
HONOLULU, (AP)—The Cosmopolitan professorship of international relations, lowest chair at the University of Hawaii, is to be filled each year hereafter by a distinguished professor or lecturer from one of the foreign countries bordering the Pacific. Dr. Hakuro Nakasako of Doshisha university, Kyoto, Japan, will be the first to occupy the chair. He is a specialist in the history of science in the Orient.
