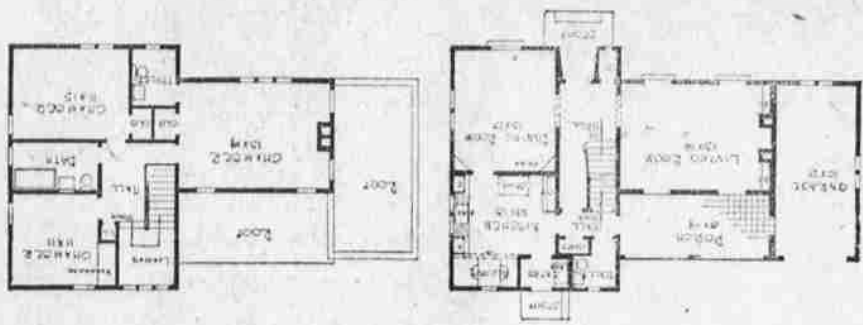

HOME WITH A BROAD FRONTAGE

Now-a-days the garage plays an important part in the lives of most of the American people, that it is as important as any of the other rooms of the house. Therefore should be convenient and attached, if possible, so as to provide heat in our northern climate. The home so illustrated, is just such a home, the attached garage feature, gives a broad frontage and makes the home appear much larger than it really is.

There are six rooms and an open screened porch, which could be easily placed in the winter if desired. The rooms are all good sized conveniently arranged. The living-room is lighted by four sets of French doors, those in front opening out onto iron balconies, while those in the rear, lead onto the screened porch. The porch is so designed that it is possible to pass from the house to the garage in bad weather, without going out-of-doors. One can pass from the front part of the house without going through the kitchen. The cost of this beautiful home is placed at \$9,900 to \$11,500, exclusive of heating and plumbing.

On the second floor are three chambers, a general bath, a private toilet off the owner's chamber.

The exterior is of frame construction with plaster-over metal bath and the roof. The interior trim is oak with oak floors for the first floor, pine to paint on the second floor, and plastered walls tinted. The floor and wainscot in bath is of tile with linoleum on the floor of the kitchen. The cost of this beautiful home is placed at \$9,900 to \$11,500, exclusive of heating and plumbing.

Powder Blast Injures Man From Robinette

BAKER, Ore., Aug. 27. (Special)—While making preparations to dynamite a deep hole in Snake river in an effort to find the body of Thomas Clark, believed to have drowned in the river Thursday, J. A. Vaughan of Robinette was seriously cut and bruised about the face and body yesterday afternoon when 15 sticks of dynamite and a number of caps prematurely exploded as he threw them from his hand. The blast, which also discharged several caps in Vaughan's pocket, blinded him and he is not expected to regain his eyesight.

The injured man is a rancher of the Willamette country and is said to be the original locator of the Iron Dyke mine. Mrs. Vaughan arrived in Baker last evening to be at her husband's bedside.

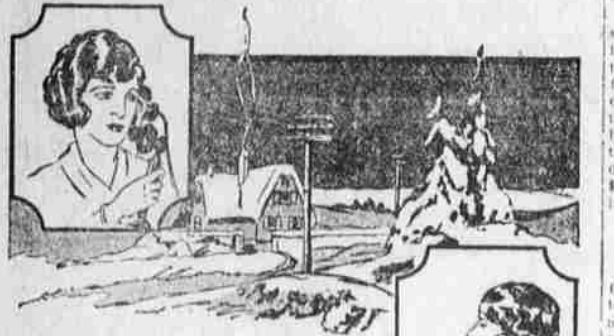

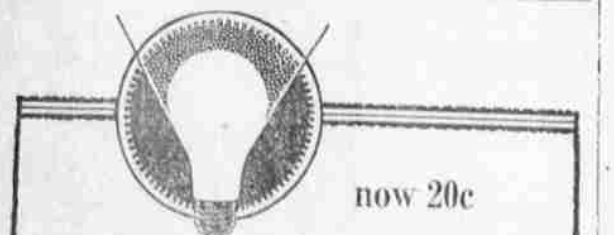
