The hectic and uncertain life of the second-rate vaudeville actor is the unusual and interesting background for "Lady Be Good," the first National feature comedy current in the Arcade theater.

### Colleen Moore Appearing at Star in "Happiness Ahead"

Moderate in art, yet a triumph for their theories in the adoption of modified cubist designs in furniture for motion picture sets, Colleen Moore's "Happiness Ahead" is now showing at the Star theater, having introduced the practical adaptation of this form of art in the furnishing of an ultra-sophisticated setting representing a Park Avenue apartment.

This type of furniture, built on straight lines with sharp angles, is undeniably low, and hence gives an illusion of height to the setting in which it is used. It has the added value to the screen of keeping the players in full view of the camera without an unnatural placing of chairs, tables, etc., according to William A. Seiter, who directed "Happiness Ahead."

Descriptions of various pieces of this modern furniture were telegraphed from Paris following a recent exhibit, and under the supervision of the art director were duplicated in the shops of First National Studios. The use of this type of furniture gives an ultra-modern atmosphere to a setting, and it is believed that such furniture will come into general use on the screen for such backgrounds.

Edmund Lowe plays opposite Miss Moore in "Happiness Ahead," other prominent members of the supporting cast being Albert Fishman, Edythe Chapman, Charles Sellen, Robert Elliot and Thana Ellis. Edmund Goulding wrote the original story, which was adapted for the screen by Benjamin Glazer.

 At 30 Out Of 100

**WASHINGTON, (AP)**—Thirty percent of the American people are undernourished because of lack of proper understanding of food values, it is declared by Miss Clyde B. Schuman, director of the National Red Cross nutrition department.

Miss Schuman traces the cause of defective teeth and eyes in children to the lack of proper foods. Lowered vitality and impaired hearing are other ill results from absence of the right vitamins, she says. To meet the problem the Red Cross nutrition service is sending out experts to teach women food values.
