Frequently they are directed unaccountably close to a bystander, breaking a pipe or pinning a shirt sleeve to a tree.

The second is "The Dance of Death," a variation of the dagger number. This entertainment is seldom indulged in when it is a life is usually sacrificed. It is the climax of a vendetta and used by gyisies women to ruffid outstare sworn enemy duels.

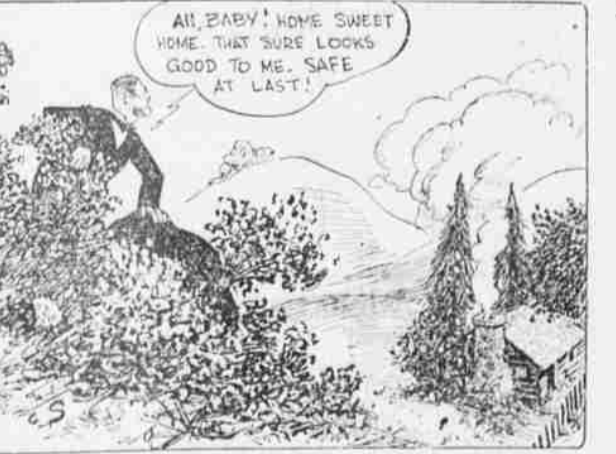
