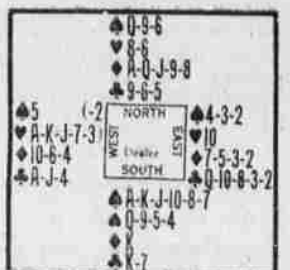

Bridge Pointers

Continuing the series started yesterday of Auction Bridge deals in which the bidding is stated and one or two questions are asked concerning the play; today's deal is:



The Bidding
 South West North East
 1 Spade 2 Hearts 3 Spades 4 Pass
 5 Spades 6 Pass 7 Pass 8 Pass
 9 South passes The Dealer; contract three spades.

The Questions
 1. What should West lead to trick 12?
 2. What four cards should be played to trick 27?
 What card should be led to trick 27?

Answer Blank
 (Readers are urged to fill this blank before looking at the answers.)
 1. To trick 1, West should lead 10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2.
 2. To trick 2, the following four cards should be played:
 1. To trick 3, the lead should be 10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2.

The Answers
 1. To trick 1, West should lead the King of Hearts. Ace-King-Jack is an attractive suit for an initial lead.
 2. The play to trick 2 should be: West, Ace of Hearts; North, Eight of Hearts; East, Deuce of Spades; South, Five of Hearts. East trumps his partner's Ace as to lead trumps up to dummy. East can see that no more Heart tricks can be won as any suit by dummy will be too high for East to over-ruff. Dummy has the Diamond suit thoroughly in hand, so the only chance for tricks is in the Club suit; obviously it should be led by East, not by West. Should East fail to trump this trick, game could not be saved.
 3. To trick 3, East should lead the Ten of Clubs. It is important to lead a Club higher than any to dummy, and leading the Ten will leave East with Queen-Eight over dummy's Nine. The Ten is a better lead than the Queen because, if closed hand have King-Jack, he might guess wrong with the Ten lead; he would cover the Queen. (Copyright John E. Dille Co.)
