MENUS

BREAKFAST — Orange juice, cereal, cream, crisp bacon, green corn, griddle cakes, milk, coffee.

LUNCHEON — Tomato succotash, fried cheese sandwiches, blackberry purée, milk, tea.

DINNER — Breaded veal cutlets, potatoes au gratin, grilled carrots, cucumber and cabbage salad, peach blanc-mange, milk, coffee.

Custard cups are half filled with blackberries sprinkled with sugar, and a plain drop dumpling butter is dropped over them. The puddings are served for 20 minutes and served warm with sugar and cream.

Green Corn Griddle Cakes — Ten or 12 ears of sweet corn, 1 cup milk, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon sugar, 2 cups flour, 3 tablespoons baking powder, 2 tablespoons melted butter.

Grate corn from cobs. These should be about 2 cups. Beat eggs until light and beat in milk, sugar and salt. Mix and add flour and baking powder and add to first mixture. Beat until smooth and add grated corn and melted butter. Beat hard and bake on a hot lightly greased griddle.

The corn must be grated on a very thin slice cut from the top of the kernels and the pulp scraped out. (Copyright, 1925, NEA Service, Inc.)

Deal D

South is the declarer with the contract No Trump. The cards played on the first trick are: West, Ten of Spades (dummy); Five of Spades; East, Nine of Spades; South, Queen of Spades.

Question No. 4 — What cards should North and South play on trick 2?

Question No. 5 — If dummy win trick 2, lead diamonds to trick 3, following in Closed Hand and the dummy win, what cards should Closed Hand and dummy play on trick 4?

4. South should lead the Ten of Clubs and, unless West play the King, North should play the Jack of Clubs. North needs as many entries as possible. If West have the King of Clubs, this method of play will give North three entries, all of which he may need.

5. South should lead the Nine of Clubs and, unless West play the King of Clubs, North should play the Queen of Clubs. The reason for these plays has been given in the answer to No. 4.

HEALTH

STOMACH DISEASES By I. Winfield Kohn, M. D., New York City, Member Gastroenterological Society

To inquire properly into the condition of the stomach requires approach from many different angles. The day of looking at the tongue, inquiring about the state of the bowels and writing out a prescription has already passed. Good work must be avoided and scientific investigation should prevail.

The first thing required is a thorough acquaintance with the history of the case, which embodies information relating to the outstanding complaint, family and personal traits, habits, and past medical records. The present medical records are then properly reviewed and analyzed.

The next requirement is a complete physical examination, which is concerned with the status of all organs, the abdominal viscera, the mouth and the throat, the chest organs, the abdominal viscera, and the organs of sex.

Following this procedure comes the employment of laboratory methods for the study of the excrementitious or eliminative material (urine, stool, and sputum); the secretory fluids such as saliva, stomach juice, intestinal juice, and bile; the blood fluid and blood constituents. At times mechanical methods of study are resorted to. Finally an x-ray study is made of

The abnormal state may be characterized by disturbances in any of the functions of the stomach which are secretory (elaboration of acid and ferments), motor (muscle movement), peristaltic (wave-like contraction), tonus (the state of muscle tension), and sensibility (sensitivity of tolerance toward irritation). These disturbances in function may have an internal cause due to disorder within the structure of the stomach itself or an external cause having its source of irritability in the nervous system outside of the stomach or in other outside organs.
