

Farm Machinery Demand Greater Than Supply Over the Nation

WASHINGTON, Sept. 26.—With more than 1,000,000 acres of wheat already in the ground, the demand for farm machinery is expected to be greater than the supply over the nation, according to the National Association of Manufacturers.

The association, which is the largest of its kind in the world, has estimated that the demand for farm machinery will be about 1,000,000 units this year, while the supply is only about 800,000 units.

The shortage is expected to be particularly acute in the case of tractors, which are in great demand for the harvesting of wheat. The association estimates that the demand for tractors will be about 100,000 units this year, while the supply is only about 80,000 units.

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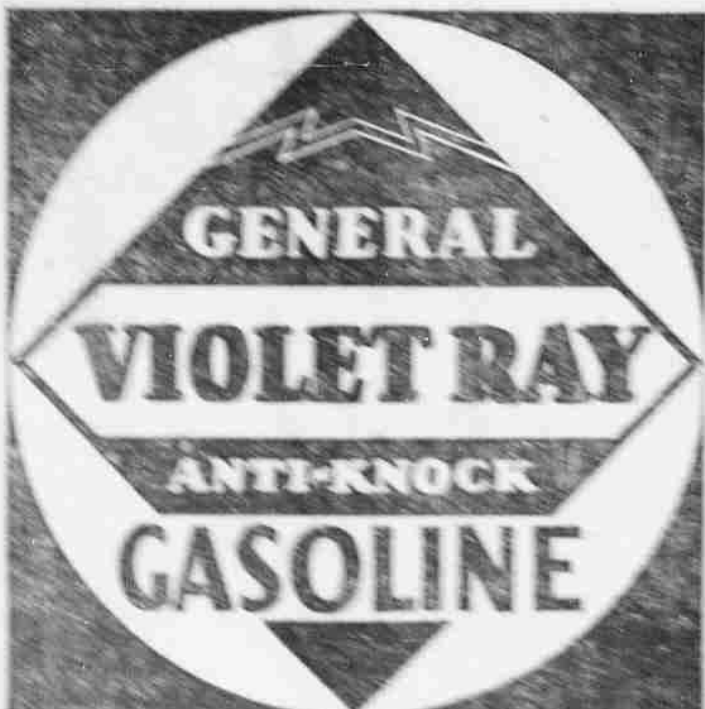
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
