Butter And Egg Prices Steady; Plenty Apples

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 29.—(A.P.)—Butter and egg prices were steady on local wholesale markets today but a generally firmer undertone was noticeable in the egg division in reflection of higher prices in New York. Pacific coast white extras were quoted 57c top in New York at the opening today which indicates an increase of about 1c a dozen within the last few days. Commission men were looking for higher prices locally early next week unless eastern quotations dropped again.

Conditioned meats moved slowly on local markets this morning, hams, beef, and medium grades of veal being in very small demand. Lamb receipts were light as were also receipts of fancy light calves, with both moving out well at firm prices. In the poultry division supplies were generous while the movement was light and prices steady.

Conditions were unchanged on wholesale fruit and vegetable markets, supplies continuing more than ample to meet demand and prices generally weak.

Apples are reaching the market here in larger quantities than the trade has absorbed. The bulk of arrivals are of fancy and filled or blemish pack stock and many are heavily colored and of other attractive, merchantable qualities.

Conditioned apples, a shade firmer today following a strengthening at primary points where shippers are asking \$4.50 per box, FOB.

Heavy Buying In Specialties Aid Stocks Upward

NEW YORK, Sept. 29.—(A.P.)—Heavy buying of the high priced specialties, several of which soared 4 to 14 points, featured the resumption of the upward price movement in today's stock market.

At the opening of the market, a general profit taking sale developed in several of the recent favorites, but these were well absorbed. Trading continued active, with total sales for the two-hour session amounting to 1,200,000 shares.

LUMBER MARKET IN BETTER SHAPE

Sales and Shipments Active With Production Material Less

SEATTLE, Sept. 29.—(A.P.)—Active sales and shipments with production materially less than either have marked the last few days of the Pacific Northwest lumber industry, the West Coast Lumbermen's association reported today. Reports of 223 mills for the week ended Sept. 22 showed production of 194,324 board feet, or 12.71 below their normal capacity. For the same period 193 mills recorded orders 1.48 per cent under production and shipments 2 per cent more than output.

Records of 123 mills for the week ended Sept. 22 showed production 179,121,255 board feet.

Shipments 179,121,255 board feet. Inventories of 100 mills for the twenty week period ended Sept. 15 showed that stocks of lumber decreased from 1,248,413,555 feet to 511,226,200, or 23.8 per cent. Orders during that period were 11.7 per cent more than production while shipments exceeded production 14.2.

Wheat Unsettled And Lower Today

CHICAGO, Sept. 29.—(A.P.)—Influenced by adverse weather for the Australia wheat crop and by unfavorable labor conditions at Australia ports wheat prices here advanced higher early today. Meanwhile the corn market went downward owing to liquidating sales of September delivery. Opening unchanged to 1/2c advance, hardened a little more and then underwent a setback, September dropping 2c from early top figures. Oats were steady. Provisions scored gains.

Aside from the September delivery, corn closed at a shade to 3/4 decline. Wheat finished unsettled 3/4 to 2c net lower, oats unchanged to 1/4c off and provisions unchanged to 1/2c rise of 20 cents.
