JOSEPH, Ore., Oct. 6 — Work was started this week toward replacing the fish screen at the foot of Wallowa lake by Bill Coleman, superintendent of the state game commission. The screen will not be rebuilt at the place where the old screen was torn out by the fish commission, as the lake has been washed since that time and the expense of extending and rebuilding the old supports would be prohibitive.

Instead, a screen suspended by a cable anchored in the water will be put in approximately 250 feet below the old one. The old screen, a mile long, will now be installed, above the screen to keep drift from away from the beach. This boom will be composed of two cables, one at high and the other at low water level, with chains stretched between them at foot intervals. While this will not keep out all drift it will prevent heavy logs from drifting down and damaging the beach.

The new screen will be placed at an angle to permit a better flow of water. Half-inch mesh will be used.
