Robinson Goes
Into Nevada To
Aid His Ticket

ENROUTE WITH SENATOR ROBINSON TO RENO, Nov. 11.—(AP)—Prosperity for every body under a democratic administration was the message brought into Nevada today by Senator Joe W. Robinson.

It was the same thought he had emphasized in San Francisco last night where he included mining—a leading industry in Nevada—among the industries divisions he contended are suffering under republican policies.

The trip of the democratic vice presidential nominee into Nevada was a bold departure from the usual route, all of whose three states are to hear the senator before he heads back east through Utah, Wyoming, Nebraska, the Dakotas, Iowa, Minnesota and Illinois. After his speech at Reno tonight he will go to Seattle and Portland.

PLUNTY OF FISH
WASHINGTON, Oct. 11.—(AP)—Chesapeake bay is regarded by the United States bureau of fisheries as one of the most prolific fishing grounds in this country. Production is estimated at 11 tons of fish per square mile against three tons for the Georges bank, off the New England coast. More than 50,000,000 pounds of white fish are taken from the bay annually and as much as 200,000,000 pounds of menhaden. The industry employs about 40,000 persons, produces about \$4,000,000 worth of fish annually and represents an investment of nearly \$17,000,000.

School Teachers
Asked To Assist

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Oct. 11. (Special).—Public school teachers of La Grande and Union county will be asked to cooperate in procuring material which is to be included in a national project looking toward a celebration of the history of education in the United States. It was announced today by H. D. Sheldon, dean of the school of education at the university.

The whole plan for the history will be gone over at a meeting of the national society in February at Cleveland, Ohio, and at that time Dean Sheldon will tell of the program of the project in Oregon. He has been appointed representative of Oregon, Washington, and Nevada on the national committee society of College Teachers of Education to foster the historical projects.
