MORIARTY HAS RESIGNED HIS DETROIT POST

DETROIT, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Following after two years of effort to build up the Detroit baseball team to a place of prominence it came regarded as a shining combination, George Moriarty has resigned as manager.

The resignation was contained in a letter to Frank J. Navin, president of the club, given out this night, in which Moriarty said the team's "poor showing was due to unfortunate circumstances." The circumstances referred to were not set out in the letter.

President Navin said the resignation had been accepted but declined to reveal if a successor had been appointed or was under consideration.

Moriarty's resignation was also reported in the Detroit press. Moriarty's resignation included those of Stanley Harris, Duke Bush, Kid Gleason, Harry Hamilton and Arthur Fletcher, with Harris being the most prominent member. The former Washington pilot was reported to have conferred with Navin here last night.
