ISSUE PARDON TO DRY HEAD IN MID - WEST

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Oct. 18.—(AP)—Governor Ed Jackson, today issued a pardon for Dr. E. R. Shumaker, superintendent of the Indiana anti-saloon league, who this morning was taken to the state penitentiary to begin serving a sixty day sentence for contempt of the Indiana supreme court.

The pardon was issued before Dr. Shumaker had reached the state penitentiary at Muncieville. It was given, according to Philip Wolford, secretary to the governor, because the governor believed the penalty "excessive."

Dr. Shumaker, however, will have to pay the \$250 fine assessed by the supreme court in addition to the sixty day sentence.
