## MANY BIG GAMES LOOM SATURDAY

### Princeton to Plays Ohio State; Alabama to Meet Wisconsin Eleven

NEW YORK (AP)—Football teams Saturday, November 3, follow the trail of the game made famous in nursery rhymes. Some of the most important games in the nation's football calendar are scheduled for Saturday. Many of these games are being played in the East.

Leading the invasion of East against West, Princeton moves on Columbus to play a terrific game with the Buckeyes of Ohio State. The Nassau Tigris turned back Ohio at Princeton last year by a score of 20 to 0, but advanced calculations gave the Easterners a much better chance.

The University of Pennsylvania took to Chicago to play the up and coming University of Chicago followers of A. A. Stagg with the Red and Blue team confident that it will be able to reverse a 13 to 7 defeat of last year in favor of the Maroon.

Jefferson and Bucknell and Villanova play.

Northwestern will try conclusions with Minnesota and Illinois while Michigan in the Western Conference.

Kansas vs. Nebraska and Missouri opposed to Drake make up two games of wide interest outside Kansas and Missouri, where the play will be run off. Nebraska stopped Kansas 47 to 13 last year.

Another play-off of a tie in the Far West will be held when Idaho and Washington State meet with a record of a 7 to 7 tie last season.

The Southern Conference standing may be scrambled after Saturday's games, for 14 of the 22 members will be playing games that count in the final conference meeting. Georgia and Auburn play a game with some tradition behind it. Sewanee will face a tough foe in Florida, and Kentucky and Vanderbilt should field out a great battle.

North Carolina and North Carolina State, neighbors and rivals of long standing, should have a world of action and Virginia and Washington and Lee meet in a game of immense importance in the Old Dominion. Maryland and V. P. I. will offer another neighborly clash, but Clemson goes a long way to meet the University of Mississippi, affectionately known as "the Miss."

## Alhambra Club Pro Leading In Golf Tourney

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Nov. 1 (AP)—Mythical old man par stood the best chances today, by a matter of one stroke or so, to lead the way home in the final 36 holes of play for the Southern California open golf championship at 334-335 at Sunset fields.

When the last professional and amateur had turned in their cards for yesterday's 18 holes, the Midweek country club professional, Fred Morrison of Alhambra, topped the ranks of title seekers with a score of 74 for a 145 aggregate in the first two days of play.

This was just a single stroke behind the 144 par for the first 36. Morrison's lead held over from Tuesday when his 71 landed him in a triple tie for first place with Olin Dutra, Brentwood country club professional and Lewis Scott, Hillcrest country club professional. Dutra slipped to a 28 yesterday, while Scott shot home for a 77.

## OREGON ELEVEN HEADING SOUTH

### McEwan Will Try New Scheme Against California Saturday

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Nov. 1 (AP)—The annual migration of some 20 University of Oregon football players to Berkeley where on Saturday the northwesterners will meet University of California on the southern sideline, got under way today.

John J. McEwan, Webfoot coach, expects to go into the air in this game with the Golden Bear.

The newest play, something heretofore unheard of at Oregon, will be tried Saturday. This shift moves Bobby Robinson, veteran full, and Johnny Kitzmiller, the young Dutchman, and a new find in

the backfield. In previous games Robinson was on the throwing end of forward passes. His aim was accuracy and the receivers had all the chance in the world to grab the ball.

The latest plan is to use Robinson on the receiving end. Kitzmiller will do the throwing. Bobby hasn't worked on the long end of a pass since he entered varsity ranks, although Kitzmiller has had experience in throwing.

So with Kitzmiller tossing and Robinson receiving McEwan expects to cross up the Bear defense. Robinson is one of the greatest open field runners in the Webfoot camp and when he gets into clear air is a hard man to stop. The trouble so far has been in getting him by the line of scrimmage.

The normal attack has taken up most of the practice time this week. McEwan also worked George Russell and Charles Williams, two clever eleven backs, on the receiving end along with Robinson.

Coach "Babe" Price pulled the surprise of the week at the football practice of the University of California varsity yesterday, when he announced that Clarence Garity, sophomore backfield man, will start at half in place of Stan Barr against the University of Oregon Saturday.

Garity, who hails from Twin Falls, Idaho, made his first lengthy appearance as a Bear griddler in the Olympic club game last week. He turned in a fine game on defense, punting well, and hit the line hard, and it is probably on the basis of this performance that he was given the call for Saturday's game.

The remainder of the California lineup was announced as, Captain Phillips and Avery cuts; Harwood and Pitt, tackles; Schwartz and Kead, guards; Hughes, center; Elson, quarter; Lom at the other halfback post; and Schmidt fullback.

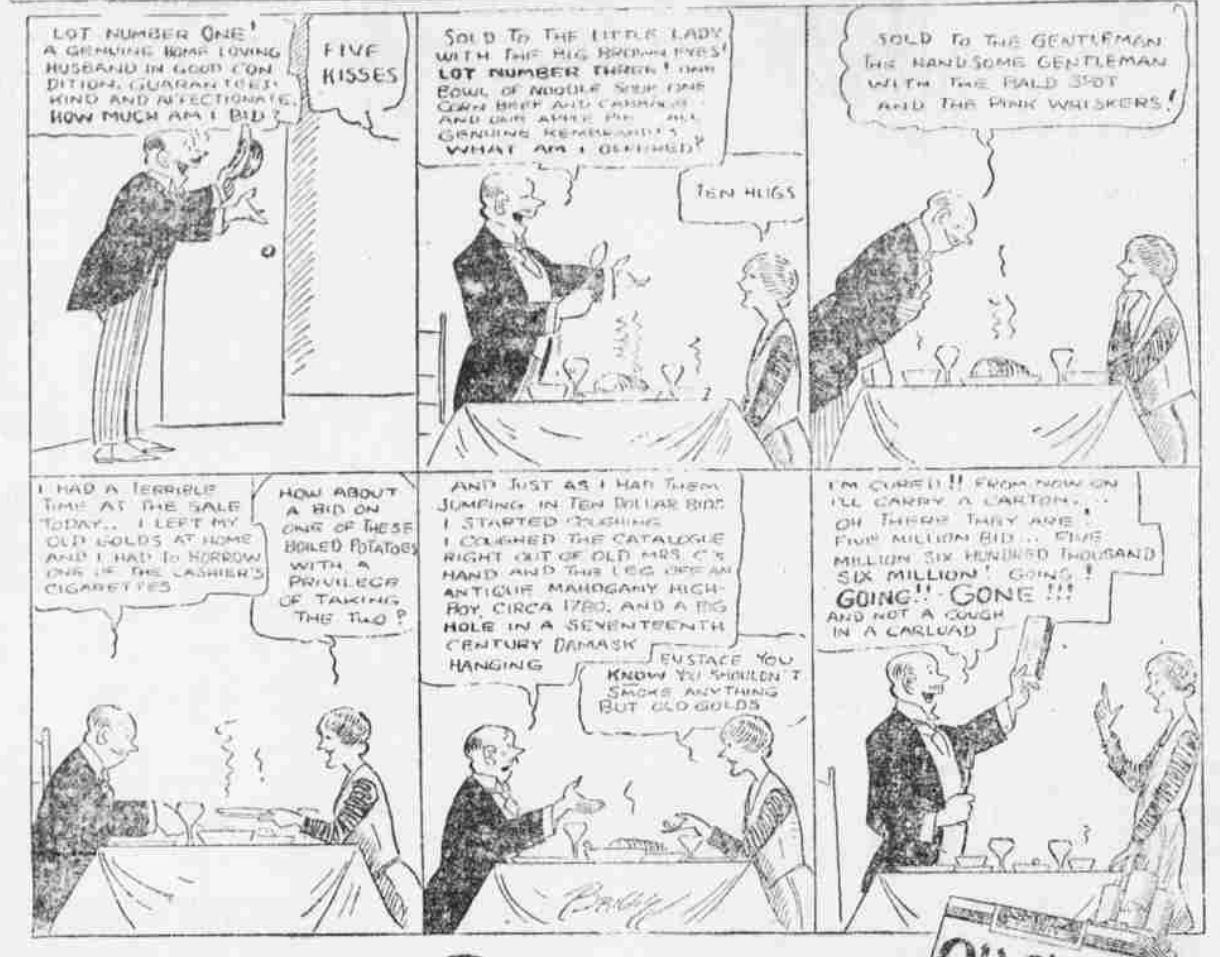
