EASTERN OREGON RACE UNCHANGED

Fendleton Loses Inter-sectional Game While Baker and Union Play Tie

Eastern Oregon football remains practically unchanged after Saturday's games. Fendleton lost an inter-sectional contest to The Dalles 13 to 0, although some circles attempt to include the Central Oregon eleven in Eastern Oregon. Regardless of the fact that The Dalles won Saturday, if Fendleton was from Baker and La Grande, the Buckaroos will be credited with the championship of this district when the season is ended.

As The Dalles does not participate in Eastern Oregon track and field meets, nor is it even included in the two basketball districts in which Fendleton, Mac-Hi, La Grande, Baker and other similar teams participate, many fans have it impossible to class it as an Eastern Oregon team in the football season.

The general rule in reference to Eastern Oregon football championships is that the winning team must not only be actually in the district, but must also play a representative Eastern Oregon schedule.

Great Grid Tumbler

The Dalles, however, has a wonderful high school grid machine, according to La Grande fans who saw the game at Fendleton Saturday. Jimmy Rosenbaum, who refereed the contest, declares that The Dalles has one of the most complicated offenses he has seen in several years. "It was the best football game I've witnessed in six years," he said yesterday. "The Dalles used double reverses, deceptive spinner plays and had a few plays which the few college teams have." Incidentally The Dalles has only lost five games in more than a decade and has held the state championship three years. If the Indians can defeat Medford and Bend, they will have a clear claim to Oregon district honors this fall.

The Dalles offense is based on speed and deception, centered around two backs, Ward and Gibson. They weigh in at 220 and 210 pounds respectively. Fendleton started the contest with practically a veteran team with Howard, Jones, Goyll and Temple in the backfield. Injury necessitated shifting of King to a wing job, leaving Erwin out of the lineup.

Baker and Union Tie
The Baker and Union high school eleven fought to an 18 to 18 tie at Fendleton Saturday, leaving the situation out of the Rose Mountains unchanged. La Grande defeated Baker 14 to 9 and meets Union in the final game of the season. If the Tigers can defeat the Huberts they can claim the strongest team in this part of the district, including Baker, Union and Walla Walla counties.

TROJANS, BEARS ARE UNDEFEATED

California Teams to Battle Soon; Oregon State Snows Montana, 44-0

Flushed with its latest win, a 13-0 conquest of Oregon, last Saturday California's Bears started preparations for the coming game with Washington. The year of 1928 has been kind to a California Bear, unbeaten since 1925 and the first in weeks of a brilliant season finds it undefeated and tied in the conference championship race with Southern California.

Hope for Stanford Defeat
Global Bear supporters, peering into the future see their alma mater triumphing over Washington at Seattle and classifies a stunning effort that would have Stanford on the short end of the score two weeks later. As California played to a scoreless tie with Southern California and the latter vanquished Stanford 18-0, last Saturday, Bear followers have some right to be enthusiastic.

The only other contest of consequence bearing next weekend, comes University of California at Los Angeles and Washington State into action at Portland. The big W. K. C. team crushed Idaho 26-0, last Saturday, while U. C. L. A. was idle. The Bruins have won three conference games and lost only to California and are expected to have no difficulty in brushing aside U. C. L. A. which has dropped its two conference engagements.

Southern California's Trojans, their conference record a hard-fought 1-1 by the victory over Stanford for the goal after revolving the ball in mid-field and Edly, Baker half, dominated the rest in the third quarter.

Union's first counter was made in the second period on a series of line blocks. A few minutes later a pass from Thomas to Rostford paved the way for a Baker touchdown and a series of punts carried the ball over.

Union scored again in the third quarter, followed by the streaker Edly when Edly ran for a touchdown.

Rostford, after intercepting a pass in mid-field, ran across the goal line in the fourth quarter for Baker's last touchdown. Both teams failed to kick a single goal.

Union has only lost two games this season to Ontario and Prairie City—the former an inter-sectional game. It appears that Ontario will win the championship of Southeastern Oregon unless a last minute upset occurs. Ontario, like The Dalles, is really outside of the Northwestern Oregon grid district and could not rightfully claim a championship unless it played a more representative schedule. This year the Ontario team has only two games scheduled this section—Baker and Union—and neither of the two teams is considered strong enough to give Ontario a strong claim in case of a double victory. It would take a win over Fendleton or Mac-Hi this year before Ontario could get into the Northwestern Oregon championship honors.

La Grande Plays Bucks
La Grande will have her chance against Fendleton a week from today—Monday, which is celebrated this year as Armistice day. The Tigers will journey to Fendleton at least yesterday by two touchdowns but the line and wide fans are hopeful, pointing out that a game is never decided until the last quarter ends and that underdogs occasionally kick over the favorite.

Several school authorities "scout-ered" the Fendleton-Talies game Saturday and it is expected that the second team this week will hurl plenty of Fendleton plays at the first string Tigers.

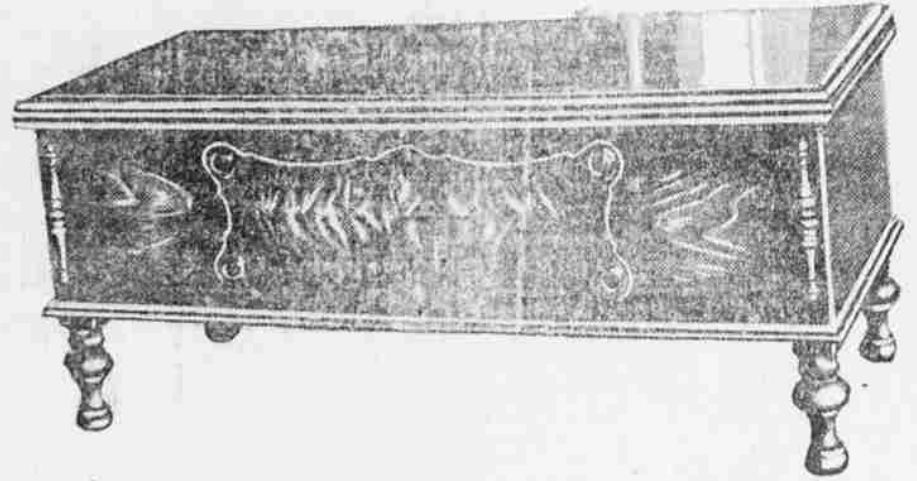

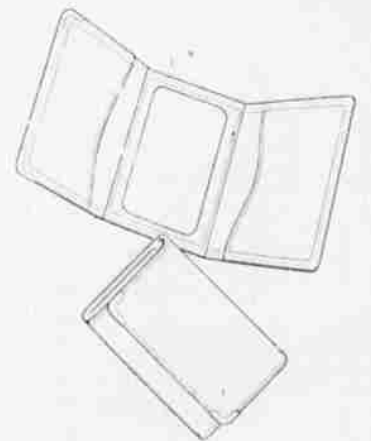
