And yet some people let their telephone cord get so badly twisted up that it looks like a nest of angle-worms.

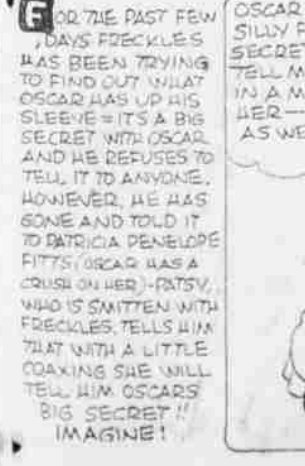
