Washington Vote Gives Hartley, Mackintosh Win

SEATTLE, Nov. 7 (AP)—Washington voters played an emphatic stamp of approval on the great majority of republican candidates in the general election yesterday. Senator C. C. DILL candidate to succeed himself in the upper house of congress and Sam H. HILL, representative in congress from the 5th district were the only democratic candidates for major offices who apparently had weathered the storm of republican bullets.

The state returned an overwhelming plurality for Hoover, while with the exception of Senator DILL and Representative HILL, the remainder of the republican congressional ticket was successful. Congressman Albert Johnson, John T. Miller, Lindley H. Hilday and John W. Summers were all returned to office by substantial majorities.

The republicans swept their state ticket into office without difficulty, the only contest of importance being between Governor Roland H. Hartley, who was seeking re-election and Scott Bellitt, democratic challenger. Bellitt conceded his opponent's election early and night.
