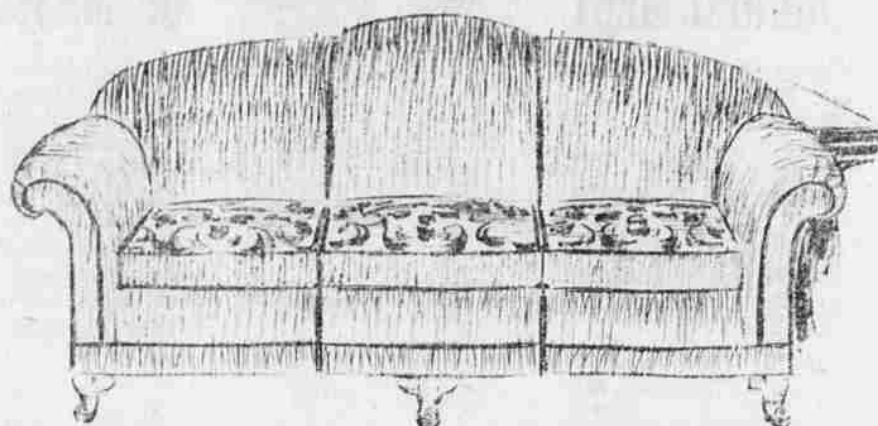

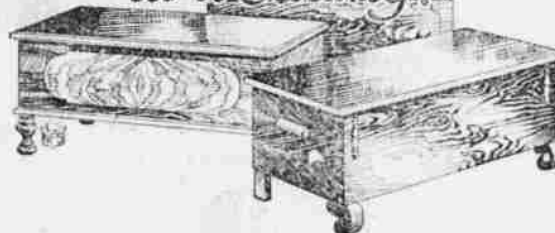

Woman Charged With Murder In Portland Today

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 8 (AP)—Charge of first degree murder will be filed against Miss Doreene Desiro, 32, of San Francisco, who shot to death Gilbert J. Piro, 30, today, in the dining room of the Madison Hotel, here late yesterday. Officers made this statement today.

Miss Desiro, who was immediately arrested, was not informed that Piro had died from the wound inflicted by the small revolver she fired at him.

"I shot it, and now I am sorry I didn't do a good job," she was quoted as saying. "Hill! He was like a coward."

She said she met Piro recently in San Francisco and that he made advances which led her to believe he intended to marry her. She came to Portland to meet him, and he said he would marry her. They were talking in a corner of the dining room, and he turned away from her with a sneer and hit of the arm. She drew a small nickel plated revolver and pulled the trigger. The bullet failed to explode and she pulled the trigger a second time, there was a sharp crack and Piro's head shot. He walked to the elevator and went to the next deck above. He was then hurried to the ship's hospital where he died.

Because the wound was tied up to the deck state, rather than federal officers took jurisdiction.

North Carolina's Majority Growing

CHARLOTTE, N. C., Nov. 8 (AP)—Herbert Hoover's majority in North Carolina is now expected to be in the neighborhood of 50,000 when official returns of the election are tabulated by the state election board two weeks hence.

Returns unofficially tabulated today gave the president-elect a lead of 45,251 with 148 of the state's 1253 precincts missing. The missing precincts were scattered in all sections of the state. The vote was Hoover 119,184; Smith 252,825.
