Powder need a small amount of sodium and chlorine for bone and general growth. One per cent salt will fill the requirements for growing and laying stock. Care is taken to see that the salt is not lumpy; small lumps of salt eaten will poison a fowl.

Best results are obtained from grain drills which are cleaned and sheltered from the weather. Drills which are not cleaned when put away soon become rusty and filled with sprouts and grain, which causes undue strain on delicate feeding mechanisms.

The best quality of seed corn is obtained by using artificial heat to get rid of excess moisture quickly. Corn dried in a hot kiln or a prairie dryer is likely to keep without molding, and to be in better condition for seed next spring.
