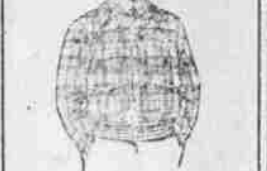
Dr. H. S. Hamilton, of Boise, dis-

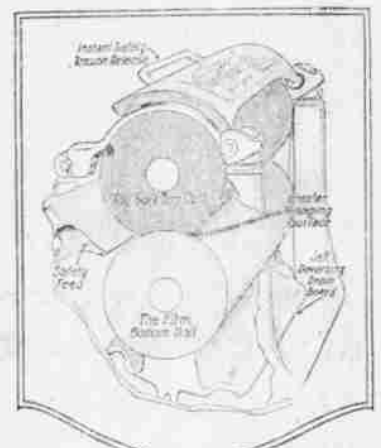
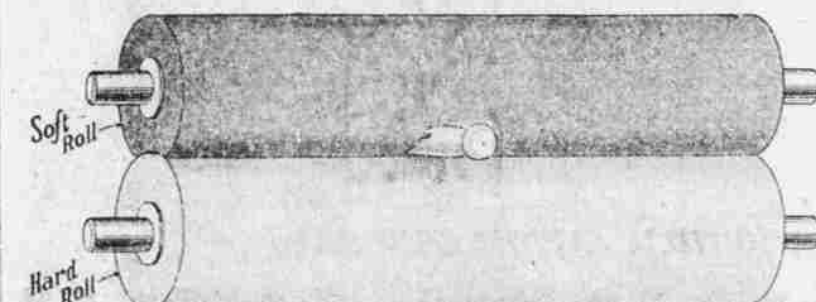

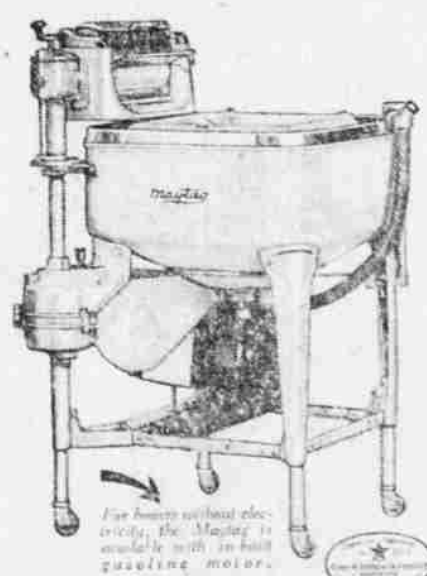
