Herbert Hoover Endorses Red Cross Campaign

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 15.—Formal endorsement of the 12th annual Red Cross roll call by President Herbert Hoover gave added impetus to the Red Cross national plan to enroll five million members for 1929.

Mr. Hoover's statement, in part, follows:

"The American Red Cross has become an indispensable part of our National Life. In peace and in war it has served in the name of the American people and in our most exacting emergencies it has never failed us. Its history of the last five years has proved the necessity for maintaining at all times a national organization prepared to act instantly and efficiently in times of great disaster.

"Its work in the Mississippi Valley flood and in lesser disasters has

been a shining example of the nation's ability to organize and act in a crisis.

"Uncle Tom's Cabin" Now Playing Here

A fortunate acquisition to the library at University City of an out-of-print architectural volume on old southern historical architecture was responsible for the building of the most faithful reproduction of an authentic scene ever recorded in films.

The scene was the slave auction rooms of Beards & Calhoun, noted ante-bellum auctioneers, which is but one of the amazing settings for "Uncle Tom's Cabin," the mammoth Universal production which opened Wednesday at the Arcade theater.

Students of southern social history declare that the reproduction is startlingly real. Four auctioneers are busily disposing of the human chattels of the South. A crowd of traders, stockmen, dandies, plantation owners, southern belles and laborers.

In one corner a gossamer auctioneer descends on the virtues of a handsome mulatto girl to a group of snoring young bloods. On another platform a second auctioneer disposes of a collection of furniture and hardware; at a third station squawking and howling livestock are the points of interest, while in a fourth corner poor Uncle Tom is being transferred from a comfortable home to an unclean and fatal future.

The brutal Simon Legree stalks importantly through the crowd examining the miserable, black wretches who stand in quivering groups, not knowing what the next minute will bring. On the walls are handbills describing goods for auction, calling attention to runaway slaves, and describing the various and diverse spiritual products.

So faithfully has Director Harry Pollard imaged this scene that the hubbub of noises and the raucous voices of the bellowing auctioneers are almost audible. Particular pains were taken in these auction rooms to make the key situations of the epic production, for it marks the beginning of Uncle Tom's immortal trip "down the river" and his subsequent introduction to Little Eva.
