Those who demand their thrills in generous portions will heartily applaud "Stand and Deliver." Rod La Roque's newest Pathé-Mille star picture, which enjoyed a most auspicious premiere at the Arcade theater Sunday.

Splendidly cast in another of the swashbuckling roles in which he has acquitted himself so well in the past, La Roque scores a distinct triumph in this fast-moving melodramatic romance. His fearless exploits and daring gestures win his audience at once.

"Stand and Deliver," which Donald Crisp directed, is a story of modern Greece, played out against a background of the land-dirty which seriously threatened that country just after the World war. La Roque has the role of Roger Norman, a wealthy young Englishman, who joins the Greek cavalry in one of the adventures. In a chivalrous mo-

ment, while attempting to save a Greek peasant girl from the evil advances of his commanding officer, he unintentionally injures his superior.

This incident forces him to make a hurried getaway with the girl. Norman and the girl, portrayed by Lupo Veloz, are captured by a bandit gang, and the former has his choice of death or of becoming a bandit. Norman chooses the latter as the lesser of the two evils. His experiences as a member of the band's band of outlaws provide thrills a-plenty—many more than Norman had anticipated when he left England.

Lupo Veloz, who will be remembered as Douglas Fairbank's leading lady in "The Gaucho," gives a splendid performance in support of La Roque, while Warner Oland, as the bandit chief and Louis Natheaux and Clarence Burton do notable work. "Stand and Deliver" is quite worthwhile.

"Danger Quest" At Colonial On Sunday.

Stories concerning the great diamond fields of Africa have proved popular with fiction readers since "The Sheik" first began to write them, so it is not surprising that those who spin yarns for the movies should turn their imaginations in this direction. This is exactly what the Messrs. Burke Jenkins and Henry Roberts Symonds have done in writing the story and continuing for the forthcoming production of "The Danger Quest," produced by Harry J. Rosen for Rayart release.

Reed Howe, star of many successful comedy-dramas for this producer-distributor combination, is again the hero in "The Danger Quest," which begins in the offices of a diamond merchant in New York, but which quickly shifts to London, described in the subtitles as "a hell-hole on the fringe of the great diamond fields of Africa." Here we find young Bob Rollins, whom we first meet in New York, in a species of inn known as "The Diggings," surrounded by a mob of evil and evil crew of "spies" who have taken up their abode in this out-of-the-way hole because they have found the boundaries of civilization too confining.
