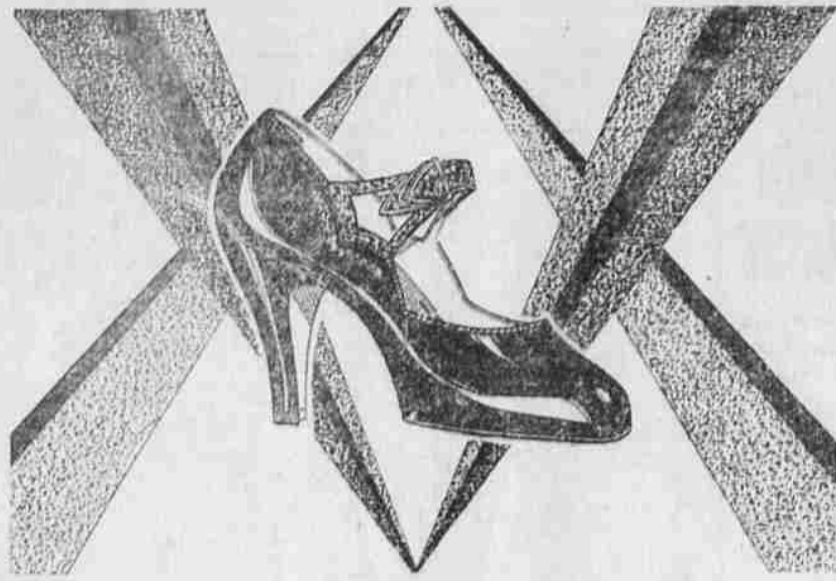

QUALITY GAMES DUE THIS WEEK

Yale-Harvard and Carnegie-New York Contests Lead Eastern Interest

NEW YORK, Nov. 20 (AP)—Quality games this week are the keynote of the eastern college football schedule. The week's less than half the usual number of games are on the list but there are such attractions as the Yale-Harvard, Carnegie Tech-New York University, Princeton-Navy, Nebraska Army and Georgetown-Portland. Most of the other major colleges close on a busy week's final games for Thanksgiving day. Games will be held the usual way between Pennsylvania and Cornell; Syracuse and Columbia; Colgate and Brown; Pittsburg and Penn State; and Washington and Jefferson and West Virginia. And even an important game is due between Chicago and New York with the two teams fresh from their last game. The Yale-Harvard duel at New Haven, both teams have been forced about a lot of miles, neither has the semblance of a change in any championship honors yet. The Yale team is expected to lead the Yale-Harvard. For Harvard the season will see a decrease if it wins. However it has a lower degree at Yale where a victory over Princeton might only a little less than one over Harvard.

BOSTON, Nov. 20 (AP)—The Boston Post says today that it has learned a general admission fact at Harvard that Arnold Harwood, of Chicago, head coach of football, will direct the team for the last time at Yale next Saturday. Although an official season has been taken, the Post says it is expected that Eddie Ahern, all-American halfback in 1927 and for the last three years head coach of an early reputation Harvard football team, will succeed his chief.

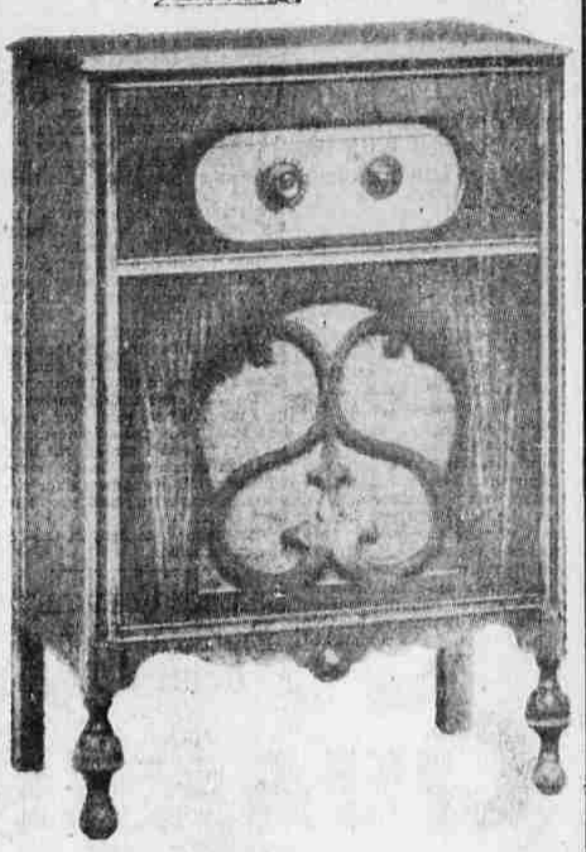

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 20 (AP)—Although the Washington State Cougars failed to beat the Southern California Trojans here Saturday, they played the undefeated warriors of Troy to such an extent that five of the regulars may not see action against the rampaging Idaho Vandals this week.
