GRID TITLES AT STAKE TOMORROW

Championships of Several Conferences Will Be Decided on Saturday

NEW YORK, Nov. 23 (AP)—Most of the football teams of the country playing tomorrow will close their doors for the season. With only a few exceptions scheduled for Thanksgiving are taking the day off and only a small group of rugged contestants will carry their war into December.

The Saturday card makes up in quality any lack of quantity. Seven games stand out in the fray. Yale and Harvard will prove a contest sufficient to attract 75,000 spectators to the Yale bowl, for the first will be the 47th meeting over a stretch of more than 30 years. The Yale team of 1927 was two touchdowns better than the prevailing Harvard aggregation but there seems to be a question if the Ills can show such superiority at home a year later.

Stanford vs. California
Another stirring game of ancient feud will be at Berkeley, Cal., and the result will have a lasting result on the Pacific coast conference title. California must defeat Stanford or see the conference title go to the University of Southern California. In the conference, California and Southern California each have registered three victories without a defeat, in addition to the triumph for they themselves lost to five weeks ago. Stanford has lost only one conference game, losing 10 to 0 to Southern California on November 3.

A victory for Stanford will amount to practical crowning of Southern California as champions for the latter team needs a minor win. Idaho, in its last conference loss.

The big intersectional show of the day will be put on at West Point with the powerful Nebraska outfit, tied but not defeated, meeting an Army team that has only one loss on its impressive record. Preparing to stop, the Cornhuskers' march with a scoreless deadlock while Notre Dame turned the Cadets' flank at New York.

Speculation as to the outcome of the West vs. East argument is hampered for lack of knowledge of the humor the Army will be in tomorrow. The team defeating Yale and Harvard on successive Saturdays should be able to repulse the western invasion but the team losing to Notre Dame could not reasonably expect kinder treatment at the hands of the Nebraskaans, the Army, too, must look ahead a week to a game with an even more powerful challenger, Stanford.

Dartmouth Plays Northwestern
An intersectional attraction in the North Atlantic states will be the swap, Dartmouth going to Evanston to play Northwestern, apparently with little to choose between the teams. The third test of sections in furnished by North Carolina State and Michigan State at Lansing.

The Princeton-Navy game at Philadelphia, marks a radical departure for each team. Princeton is going right on with its season as if Yale had not been met and Navy is at its climax with a Tiger instead of an Army made for an opponent. The Mulishipmen have known all season that they had to play Princeton and probably will be on edge at Franklin field. It will be no romp for the Tiger.

New York Paces Carnegie
Pittsburg will have a corner on football interest in that section of the country on account of a battle to the death between Carnegie Tech, with no liability charged to it, and New York university, all results except a lone defeat. Carnegie has a chance to join in any movement over football supremacy by defeating the Violet while New York may be able to throw out its record by Georgetown if it can win from the Tartans.

The middle west will watch the undereated but tied Wisconsin team try to win a conference title by defeating Minnesota.

Other games in the east bring rivalry of standing together, La Fayette and Lehigh, Bucknell and Dickinson, Georgetown and Fordham Rutgers and Swarthmore among others. Davis and Elkins and Villanova should engage in a back struggle as these two teams seem to have reached the peak of their form earlier in the season.

Ohio State vs. Illinois
In addition to the crucial game at Madison, Wis., Ohio State and Illinois may fight it out all afternoon at Champaign, Indiana and certain are certain to have a lot of fun, and Iowa and Michigan will be well worth while.

Kansas and Missouri will furnish a holiday at Columbia and SMU water will watch the Oklahoma Aggie and Oklahoma mix.

The south takes its football with the Thanksgiving turkey but a few games will be played tomorrow. Washington and Lee will play Maryland at Washington. Vanderbilt should wrap Centre and Tulane will not expect a serious menace in the visit of Louisiana college in New Orleans.

Beavers Start East For Game With New York

CORVALLIS, Ore., Nov. 23 (AP)—Thirty Oregon State College football men, with Coach Paul J. Schlader and the usual retinue of trainers, assistant coaches and managers, today were en route for the Atlantic coast. Three they will meet New York university on Thanksgiving day in an international struggle in Yankee stadium. Fans who gathered for the rally as the team departed, expect the Beavers to show real strength as representatives of the west, following a conference season during which they were more or less erratic, playing like champions one week, and slumping the next. The team will reach Chicago Sunday and will work on Soldiers Field Monday and Tuesday before going to New York. This is the first time a far-western team has played on the Atlantic coast, although the record will not stand long, since Stanford will meet the Army two days later in New York.

The Oregon State eleven is going to New York by a northern route on the Olympian, but on the return trip, the second will pass through La Grande. It is expected that they will be on No. 17 on the morning of Wednesday, Dec. 5.

Statistics recently issued on the Oregon - Oregon State football game in Corvallis last Saturday have been received here and show that Cecil Sherwood, of La Grande, made exactly 27 per cent of the total yardage of both teams from scrimmage. Sherwood made 46 yards, more than half of the entire

O. S. C. yardage. Oregon made 162 yards, 16 yards less than O. S. C. Total yardage from scrimmage for both teams was 229.

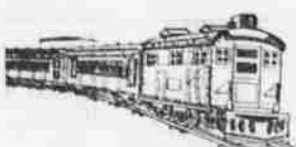
